Sir William McKell, G.C.M.G., Q.C., Governor-General, who was to have opened the Grand Circuit, to convey to Her Majesty the Queen and Members of the Royal Family, the deep sense of grief shared by us all in the hour of the Nation's loss, and a pledge of loyalty to Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II.



BETTING COMPLAINTS.

*

Bookmakers must write the name of the horse and the amount of the bet clearly on each ticket issued, otherwise in the case of dispute the decision may be given against them.



Every patron should see that the proper change and legible Betting Ticket or correct pay out is received before leaving the Bookmaker, as subsequent claims may not be recognised.



The Betting Supervisors will be in attendance for five minute after each race at the back of each betting ring in each enclosure.



In the event of a dispute or non-payment of a wager on presentation of the Betting Ticket to the Bookmaker, patrons are advised to lodge the Ticket with the Betting Supervisor not later than thirty minutes after the conclusion of the race in respect of which the ticket was issued, such ticket shall be presented intact and in no way mutilated, otherwise the decision may be given against the person mutilating such ticket.

SCRATCHINGS.

At licensed Trotting Meetings held within forty miles of the General Post Office, Sydney, after an owner or trainer has accepted with a horse for a race he shall, if such horse be subsequently withdrawn from the subject race, be liable to a fine of Five Pounds (£5) unless the withdrawal is ordered by the Club's Stewards. Provided that the Stewards may grant exemption from the operation of this rule where a trainer has two horses engaged in the one race or is injured during the progress of a meeting or if it be proved to their satisfaction that the horse withdrawn is so seriously injured or otherwise incapacitated that it was impossible for him to be brought to the meeting to compete.

DEFINITION OF A "STARTER."

A "starter" in any horse race shall mean and include every horse whose rider, jockey or driver shall have been ordered by the Starter to line up at or behind the starting point and which has not been subsequently withdrawn before the start by order or permission of the Stewards.

IMPORTANT NOTICE!

- Every Driver in a Trotting Race registered under the Rules of the New South Wales Trotting Club Ltd., must wear a protective Skull Cap.
- During the running of a race, no driver shall pull out to allow a competitor through to the disadvantage of the others. For so doing, he may be disqualified or subject to a fine, not exceeding £50.
- In the event of a Trainer having two horses engaged in the one race, it shall be compulsory for him to drive the horse nominated in his name (Classics and special restricted age events excepted).
- At Trotting Meetings in the Metropolitan Area of Sydney, the employees of a Licensed Trainer shall not be represented as the trainer of any horse in his employer's stable, nor shall he drive any such horse in a race except by special permission of the Committee or Stewards.
- Bandages shall not be worn by any horse competing at meetings of this Club. unless such bandages are securely fastened or sewn.
- No Sulky exceeding 4ft. 2ins. In width over-all shall be used in any race at Licensed Trotting Meetings within 40 miles of the G.P.O., Sydney.
- At Licensed Trotting Meetings held within forty miles of the General Post Office, Sydney, a horse having competed in hoppies shall not compete unhoppied within a period of six months and vice versa, unless ordered by the Stewards. This Regulation shall not apply to Classic Races.
- At all Licensed Trotting Meetings where the Judge declares a dead-heat between two or more horses, the owners of such horses shall divide the stakes.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in the Rules, the decision of the Stewards with reference to any objection lodged under Part 9 of the Rules shall be final and conclusive and not subject to appeal, provided that this rule shall apply only to Trotting Meetings in the Metropolitan Area of Sydney.
- Where a horse does not finish within the distance post in its respective race, the entry of such horse may be rejected for the next two meetings at Harold Park, unless a satisfactory explanation can be given by the Driver.

Information for Totalisator Investors AT HAROLD PARK RACEWAY

THE RULES GOVERNING THE TOTALISATOR ARE EXHIBITED ON THE TOTALISATOR HOUSES.

No person under the age of 21 years is permitted to bet on the Totalisator, vide Section 12 of the "Totalisator Act. 1916," as follows:—

"If any person under the age of Twenty-one Years wagers by means of the Totalisator, he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One Pound for the first offence, and not less than Five Pounds nor more than Fifty Pounds for each subsequent offence."

The Totalisator is closed at the time the race starts and no nyestment will be received after that time.

A Warning Bell will ring at the Totalisator ten minutes before the advertised time of starting, and also prior to the starting time. The machine may close at any time after the second Bell stops ringing.

The top of the White Ribbon indicates the "odds" for a win. The top of the yellow Ribbon indicates the "odds" for a place. Each horse starting in a race will be denoted on the Totalisator by a number corresponding with its number in the Race Book.

THE WIN TOTALISATOR.—The amount available for dividend shall be divided among the investors on the winning horse.

THE PLACE TOTALISATOR .-

- (a) Three Dividend Races.—Where there are eight or more starters the amount available for dividend shall be divided into three equal parts, and one part shall be divided among the investors on the first horse, another part among the investors on the second horse, and the remaining part among the investors on the third horse.
- (b) Two Dividend Races.—Where there are five, six or seven starters, the amount available for dividend shall be divided into two equal parts, and one part shall be divided among investors on the first horse and the other part shall be divided among the investors on the second horse.

If only four or a less number of horses start in a race, the Place Totalisator will not be opened.

BRACKETS.—The Totalisator can only provide for sixteen horses, so when there are more than sixteen acceptors the difficulty is overcome by bracketing. There may be one or several brackets

Horses bracketed together will be clearly indicated in the race book and given one number, except that one shall have a distinguishing letter following the number, the second horse in the bracket is red in the semaphores and on saddle cloths. A person wishing to invest on either horse will ask for a ticket on the totalisator number, and the other horse will run for him as well as the horse of his choice, but if horses bracketed together run in a dead-heat or both run into places, they shall be treated as seperate horses for the purpose of dividend.

Tickets are sold at the Totalisator at :5s., 10s., £1 and £5.

Tickets on any horse for a win or a place may be purchased at any Selling Window.

Any investor may invest an unlimited amount on any horse.

Three (3) Totalisator Houses for Selling and Paying are available in the Paddock Enclosure, and a Totalisator is established in each of the Leger and Flat Enclosures.

Every investor should see that the proper change, ticket or dividend is received before leaving the window, as subsequent claims will not be recognised.

All dividends are calculated on the unit of investment and will be exhibited on the Totalisator Houses immediately after the race is run. The unit of investment in all enclosures is 5s.

In the event of a dead-heat for first place, the dividends are paid in accordance with the result of such dead-heat.

Dividends on a race not collected prior to the start of the next race will only be paid at the "Late Dividend" windows.

Dividends not collected on to-night's races may be collected at AUTOMATIC TOTALISATORS LTD., No 5 Phillip Street, Sydney, on Thursday, 21st February, and thereafter on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of each week between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., for a period of one month after the meeting.

Postai Address: Automatic Totalisators Limited, 5 Phillip Street, Sydney.

In the event of the Committee declaring all investments off, the money invested will be returned to the investors.

Every investor and holder of a ticket shall be deemed to have made herself or himself acquainted with the Rules and Conditions of the Totalisator which are exhibited on the Totalisator Houses, and to have agreed to be bound thereby.

REGISTRATION OF BOOKMAKERS

The Committee reserves the right to refuse the registration of any Bookmaker to ply his vocation at Meetings of the New South Wales Trotting Club Ltd. without assigning any reason.

A Licensed Bookmaker will not be permitted to act as Clerk at Meetings of the New South Wales Trotting Club Ltd.

Bookmakers must produce their Government Tax Receipts when demanded by the Police or an Official of the New South Wales Trotting Club Ltd.

Bookmakers calling the odds to any horse straight out must, on demand, lay the odds quoted to an amount of not less than £5 in the Saddling Paddock; £4 in the Leger Reserve, and £2 in the Flat, but so that in no case shall the Bookmaker be compelled to lose more than £100 on any straight-out wager demanded by the

In Double Event Betting a Bookmaker must lay the odds quoted to an amount of not less than £1 in the Saddling Paddock, and 10/- in the Lever Reserve and Flat.

In Double Events Bets :-

(a) Bets are determined when the first event is lost.

(b) If either is decided in the backer's favour and the other results in a dead-heat, the money betted must be put together and equally divided.

(c) If both horses backed run dead-heats, the money betted must be put together and divided in the proportion of one-fourth

to the backer and three-fourths to the layer,

(d) If the horse backed for the first event wins and the horse backed for the second event does not start, the bet shall be play or pay, unless otherwise agreed at the time the bet is made; provided that bets made on the course on the day of the race on which both events are run are void :—

(1) If the horse backed for the first event does not come under

the starter's orders, or

(2) If the horse backed for the second event is scratched before the horse backed for the first event comes under the Scarter's orders, or

(3) If the horse backed for the first event wins and the horse backed for the second event does not come under the

Starter's orders, or

(4) If the first event is divided after the bet is made.

Bookmakers must notify the Secretary of the New South Wales
Trotting Club Ltd., in writing of all unpaid bets within seven (7)

days of the Meeting.

On all tickets the name of the horse and amount of the bet must be clearly written. Should a dispute arise and it is found that this has not been done, a decision may be given against the Bookmaker. After November 17th, 1916 it shall be imperative for Bookmakers operating at meetings of the New South Wales Trotting Club Ltd., to have a number of the ticket and the name of the Bookmaker printed on the Betting Ticket.

No Bookmaker shall issue a Betting Ticket upon which the name of any other Bookmaker has been printed and no Bookmaker shall

sell or transfer a Betting Ticket to any other Bookmaker or to any person on his behalf.

A Betting Ticket shall not be issued by a Bookmaker unless there is printed thereon the name and address of the Bookmaker by or on whose behalf it is issued. The name or address if impressed on the ticket with a Rubber Stamp shall not be deemed to have been printed.

A Betting Ticket which has been previously issued shall not be issued by a Bookmaker or by any person acting on his behalf.

A Bookmaker issuing a Betting Ticket at meetings of the New

A Bookmaker issuing a Betting Ticket at meetings of the New South Wales Trotting Club Ltd., without having his name printed on the ticket, shall be liable to have his licence cancelled.

In all disputed bets, the ticket must be submitted to the Stewards intact and not in any way mutilated, otherwise a decision may be

given against the person mutilating the ticket.

A horse shall be deemed to be a starter in a race and under the Starter's hands immediately upon the Driver of such horse being ordered by the Starter to line up at or behind the starting post; provided that the Stewards shall have power to order the withdrawal of a horse from any race either before or after it has come under the Starter's orders, if, in the opinion of the Stewards, such horse is unfit or unable to run by reason of injury or otherwise,

In the event of the Stewards ordering or permitting a horse to be withdrawn from a race after the time for scratching, they may declare off all bets made on the racecourse on such race on the day it is being run or they may make such order as to the settlement of such bets made prior to the withdrawal as in their discretion

they may deem just.

In the event of any infringement of the above Regulations, or in the case of any disputed Bets, it is requested that the Secretary be at once communicated with, when disputed Bets will be dealt with by the Stewards at the conclusion of the last race of the day,

In the event of non-payment of a Bet upon presentation of the Betting Ticket to the Bookmaker, the holder of such Ticket is advised to lodge the Ticket with the Betting Supervisor not later than thirty minutes after the conclusion of the race in respect of which the Ticket was issued.

On lodgement of the Ticket as abovementioned, the Club will as an act of grace, endeayour to collect such Bet on behalf of the

holder of the Ticket.

The Betting Supervisors may be located for five minutes after each race at the back of each betting ring in each enclosure.

Rule 87 (a) It is hereby declared that the Stewards shall also have power to entertain and decide any disputes relating to bets.

(b) At a Licensed Trotting Meeting held within a radius of 40 miles from the General Post Office, Sydney where a betting Supervisor is employed by a Club, the Stewards may delegate to him all or any of the powers conferred upon them by Rule 87 (a) subject to such conditions as they may prescribe.

(c) Notwithstanding anything in the Rules of Trotting of the New South Wales Trotting Club Ltd. contained or implied the decision of the Stewards in any betting dispute at a Licensed Trotting Meeting held within 40 miles of the General Post Office, Sydney, shall be final and conclusive.
