DOUBLES and QUINELLA TOTALISATOR

- 1. A "Doubles" totalisator will operate on "this and the next" for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Races. A "Quinella" totalisator will operate for the 7th Race.
- 2. Tickets will be issued in denominations of 5/- at windows designated accordingly. They will show the racebook number of the horse in the 1st leg above the racebook number of the horse in the 2nd leg.
- 3. In selecting a "Double" the investor must ask for the racebook number of the horse required in the 1st leg First and then the racebook number of the horse required in the 2nd lea.
- 4. An investor may invest in a "Double" as many times as desired. For example, if he wishes to Couple Nos. 3 and 7 more than once he should say "Nos. 3 and 7, two tickets," or whatever number of times he requires the double.
- 5. FIELD BETTING-

Certain windows will be set aside for Doubles "Field" betting. In "Field" betting an investor selects one horse in any one leg of a "Double" with ALL the runners in the other leg. For example, a horse, say No. 7, in the 1st leg, could be coupled with all the horses (the "Field") in the 2nd leg, in which case the investor would ask for "No. 7 and the Field," or the investor may desire to have all runners (the "Field") in the 1st leg coupled with a horse, say No. 5, in the 2nd leg, in which case he would ask for "the Field and No. 5." Of course, the investor's outlay is greater, being governed by the number of horses in "the Field." A "Doubles" ticket in "Field" betting can be issued just as quickly as a "Doubles" ticket for a combination of only two horses.

- 6. In Totalisator Doubles you are entitled to A REFUND OF YOUR STAKE in the following circumstances-
 - (a) If your FIRST horse is scratched or withdrawn regardless of whether your second horse wins or does not start.
 - (b) If your SECOND horse is scratched or withdrawn BEFORE your first horse starts, regardless of whether your first horse wins or loses.

(c) If your FIRST horse wins and your second horse is scratched or withdrawn after the running of the race in which your first horse was a starter.

NO REFUND is made if your first horse loses and your second horse is scratched or withdrawn after the running of the race in which your first horse started.

7. QUINELLA (RACE PAIRS) BETTING-

This is a form of "Doubles" betting on any one race. Unless otherwise announced, it will operate on THE LAST RACE ONLY. Where a "Quinella" operates the investor may select any two horses in the race, for example, Nos. 3 and 11, and if those horses fill the first two placings, IRRESPECTIVE OF WHETHER THEY ARE PLACED FIRST AND SECOND OR SECOND AND FIRST, the investors on Nos. 3 and 11 are entitled to collect the dividend declared on the "Quinella." "Quinella" tickets may be obtained at all "Doubles" windows.

WARNING TO PATRONS OF DOUBLES and QUINELLA TOTALISATORS

It is possible that there may not be any investors on a winning combination in which event the Doubles and Quinella pools would be divided among the investors as follows :-

STEWARDS' REPORT

MEETING, 25th FEBRUARY, 1959

GLOUCESTER PARK HANDICAP: "Ascot Raid" (G. D. Wilson) and "Posh" (R. Parker) began badly, and "Claymore" (J. Harrington) broke soon after the start. In future, "Posh" will be restricted to moving start races only, and warnings were issued to each of the other horses.

G. D. Wilson, "Ascot Raid," was severely reprimanded for crossing to the rails too quickly at the turn out of the straight, causing "Malvern's Hope" (L. O'Connell) to be checked. "Marne" (W. Gibaud) also

received a slight check.

WAYVILLE HANDICAP: A warning was issued to "Kentucky Club" (P. Wells) which began badly. The 24-yard barrier contacted the legs of "Dual Peak" (J. Leonard) on release, causing this horse to break. P. Wells, "Kentucky Club," was severely reprimanded for attempting to push his way from inside "Scotch Flower" (W. Hickey) at the turn into the straight with one lap to go.

When the leader, "Brigadier Wilkes" (L. Hunt) checked quickly at the turn out of the straight after the start, "Bold Scott" (G. Gath) clipped his wheel, puncturing a tyre. "Swing Set" (W. Webster) suffered a slight check. Hunt was cautioned against slowing the pace too suddenly when in the lead.

P. Wells was forced to stop driving "Kentucky Club" on two occasions in the run down the home straight,

as the horse was hanging in badly.

INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP - 2nd Qualifying Division - 1st Heat: "Maori Hall" (C. Allen) and "Illawarra Ayr" (C. Elliott) began badly. "Illawarra Ayr" (C. Elliott), which was lugging badly in the back straight in the last lap, broke when his driver attempted to pull him off the horses inside him. He met no interference.

INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP - 2nd Qualifying Division — 2nd Heat: "Befana Spring" (N. Gath) began badly. This caused "Diabolo Don" (L. Treasure) to be checked.

B. Bastin, "Apparently," was reprimanded for shifting ground in the front straight with two laps to go, causing "Grand Monarch" (G. Rothacker) to be slightly checked.

K. Brook, "Beloro," was reprimanded for unorthodox use of his whip, in the concluding stages of the race.

STEWARDS' REPORT-Continued.

INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP - 2nd Qualifying Division - 3rd Heat: "Alcoran" (J. Moore), "Vapour Trail" (F. Wilkins) and "Whispering" (G. Rothacker) began badly, "Super Royal" (P. Wells) suffered a severe check from "Whispering" at the start. "Interpretation" (W. Bowyer) began slowly.

At the turn out of the back straight in the second lan. "Imperial Robert" (L. Orwin) tipped the near wheel of "First Kiss" (G. Turnbull), puncturing the tyre.

In the home straight in the last lap, "Alcoran" (J. Moore) mixed its gait for a few strides, broke a crupper and stumbled, causing a check to "Vapour Trail" (F. Wilkins).

INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP — 2nd Qualifying Division - 4th Heat: "Habieby" (W. Bowyer) and "Rendral" (J. Johnston) began badly, 'Sheffield Globe" (D. Fitzpatrick) suffered a check from "Habieby" at the start.

In the back straight in the first lap, "Main Power" (M. Adams) jumped and broke, causing "Sheffield

Globe" (D. Fitzpatrick) to be checked.

"Caduceus" (F. Kersley) hung in on to "Fiery Land" (N. Gath) when going to the front at the turn into the straight in the last lap. Kersley was advised to show extreme caution when going around the field with this horse in future races.

MEETING, 28th FEBRUARY, 1959

- HAROLD PARK STAKES: An inquiry was held into the mix-up in the straight with one lap to go. After questioning I. Shalders, "Joyous," F. Kersley, "Mr. Emotions." R. Parker, "Vain Villa," J. Glasheen. "Gleaming Light," and from their own observations, the Stewards were satisfied that I. Shalders shifted ground too quickly contacting "Mr. Emotions" and in turn, "Merryn Globe" (G. Rothacker). "Carinaette" (A. Ritchens), "Gleaming Light" and "Vain Villa" suffered severe checks. The driver's licence of I. Shalders was suspended for four weeks.
- QUALIFYING STAKES: The connections of "Tennessee Red" were fined £2 for the late scratching of this horse.

W. J. Allan, "O'Dearo," was severely reprimanded for shifting ground throughout the race, in particular

causing "Reminis" (D. Fitzpatrick) to be checked at the turn out of the home straight in the last lap, and "Tanyinna" (G. Gilbert) to be checked in the back straight in the last lap.

"Our Delight (I. Shalders), which was hitting its knee badly, broke without interference at the turn

into the straight in the second lap.

1959 INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP—3rd Qualifying Division—First Heat: "Rich Dale" (G. Rothacker) and "Suzendy" (F. Kersley) began badly. "Mimosa Lawn" (J. Brown) began slowly. When the field checked suddenly at the turn out of the back straight in the third lap, "Rich Dale" (G. Rothacker), which was checked quickly by its driver. G. Rothacker, mixed its gait for a few strides.

1959 INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP—3rd Qualifying Division—Second Heat: When checked off "Vapour Trail" (F. Wilkins), which began slowly, "Columbus" (G. Rothacker) left its gear. In future, "Befana Spring" (N. Gath), which began badly, will be drawn wide.

1959 INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP—3rd Qualifying Division—Third Heat: "Noble Western" (F. Wilkins) broke soon after the start.

1959 INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP—3rd Qualifying Division—Fourth Heat: An inquiry was held into the reason for "Kodak" (M. Johnson) contacting the wheel of "Beloro" (K. Brook) at the turn out of the straight with two laps to go. After questioning G. D. Wilson, "Dusty Miller," G. Gath, "Heroic Action," M. Johnson, "Kodak" and K. Brook, "Beloro," and from their own observations, the Stewards established that after sprinting hard in the previous lap, "Dusty Miller," on passing the winning post, dropped the bit, and eased as though the race was finished, with the result that the field packed quickly, and "Kodak" became entangled in "Beloro's" wheel. Both horses were pulled up, and "Derive" (G. Rothacker), which was trailing, also pulled up. The occurrence was accidental. "Fiery Land" (N. Gath), began badly.

1959 INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP—3rd Qualifying Division—Fifth Heat: "Imperial Robert" (L. Orwin), galloped from the barrier.
"Volo Gift" (N. Gath) and "Illawarra Ayr" (C. Elliott) began badlv.

Notice to Totalisator Patrons

LATE DIVIDENDS from the PREVIOUS meeting may be collected at Late Dividend windows in the Paddock "A" and Leger "A" Totalisator houses from one half-hour before the first race until the start of the second race.

Late Dividends from EARLIER meetings may be collected at the offices of Automatic Totalisators Limited, 472 Bourke Street, Melbourne, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. and thereafter each day for a period of one month from date of meeting (Saturdays and Public Holidays excepted).

ODDS INDICATORS. The barometer-type Totalisator indicator at the eastern end of the track will show odds for a Win (White) and Place (Red), but will not indicate odds beyond 100 to 1.

The projection-type Indicator situated over or near each Totalisator House will show odds for both Win and Place up to 200 to 1. Extreme odds-on will be indicated by a red spot.

PLACE BETTING. "PLACE" bets are 1, 2, 3 when eight or more horses remain in a race when the Totalisator is opened, and 1, 2 when not fewer than five nor more than seven horses remain in when the Totalisator is opened.

The "PLACE" Totalisator will not be opened when four horses or fewer start in a race.

Warning bells will be rung outside the Totalisator Houses 15 minutes and 5 minutes before each race.

MINORS NOT TO BET. No person under the age of 21 years shall be permitted to bet on the Totalisator, vide Section 14 (1) of Totalisator Act, 1930.
