DOUBLES and QUINELLA TOTALISATOR

- A "Doubles" totalisator will operate on "this and the next" for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Races.
 A "Quinella" totalisator will operate for the 7th Race.
- Tickets will be issued in denominations of 5/- at windows designated accordingly. They will show the racebook number of the horse in the 1st leg above the racebook number of the horse in the 2nd leg.
- In selecting a "Double" the investor must ask for the racebook number of the horse required in the 1st leg First and then the racebook number of the horse required in the 2nd leg.
- 4. An investor may invest in a "Double" as many times as desired. For example, if he wishes to Couple Nos. 3 and 7 more than once he should say "Nos. 3 and 7, two tickets," or whatever number of times he requires the double.
- 5. FIELD BETTING-

Certain windows will be set aside for Doubles "Field" betting. In "Field" betting an investor selects one horse in any one leg of a "Double" with ALL the runners in the other leg. For example, a horse, say No. 7, in the 1st leg, could be coupled with all the horses (the "Field") in the 2nd leg, in which case the investor would ask for "No. 7 and the Field," or the investor may desire to have all runners (the "Field") in the 1st leg coupled with a horse, say No. 5, in the 2nd leg, in which case he would ask for "the Field and No. 5." Of course, the investor's outlay is greater, being governed by the number of horses in "the Field." A "Doubles" ticket in "Field" betting can be issued just as quickly as a "Doubles" ticket for a combination of only two horses.

- 6. In Totalisator Doubles you are entitled to A REFUND OF YOUR STAKE in the following circumstances—
 - (a) If your FIRST horse is scratched or withdrawn regardless of whether your second horse wins or does not start.
 - (b) If your SECOND horse is scratched or withdrawn BEFORE your first horse starts, regardless of whether your first horse wins or loses.

(c) If your FIRST horse wins and your second horse is scratched or withdrawn after the running of the race in which your first horse was a starter.

NO REFUND is made if your first horse loses and your second horse is scratched or withdrawn after the running of the race in which your first horse started.

7. QUINELLA (RACE PAIRS) BETTING-

This is a form of "Doubles" betting on any one race. Unless otherwise announced, it will operate on THE LAST RACE ONLY. Where a "Quinella" operates the investor may select any two horses in the race, for example, Nos. 3 and 11, and if those horses fill the first two placings, IRRESPECTIVE OF WHETHER THEY ARE PLACED FIRST AND SECOND OR SECOND AND FIRST, the investors on Nos. 3 and 11 are entitled to collect the dividend declared on the "Quinella." "Quinella" tickets may be obtained at all "Doubles" windows.

STEWARDS' REPORT

MEETING, 14th FEBRUARY, 1959 RUBICON HANDICAP—"Florence Raider" (K. Williams) began badly. In future, it will be drawn wide at the

"Ulverstone" (L. Welsh) began slowly.

Warnings were issued to "Smart Lulu" (W. Robinson) which swung to a pace at the first turn, and "Elwyn's Design" (H. Johnson) which broke in the first and third laps.

QUALIFYING STAKES-"New Scott" (I. Wilson) and "Olympic Pool" (S. Rothacker) broke at the first turn. "First Secret" (J. Glide) suffered a serious check. "Retrial" (W. Marshall) hung out slightly in the back straight in the second lap, clipping the wheel of "High Up" (W. Hickey) and breaking. The occurrence was accidental. "Raimeno" (F. Kersley) hung in badly at the turn

into the back straight in the second last lap, causing "Retrial" (W. Marshall) to be seriously checked. Kersley was warned that any further waywardness by this horse in races will mean refusal of its nomination

at the Showgrounds.

I. G. Wilson, driver of "New Scott" was severely reprimanded, and told that he would not be granted a metropolitan permit until more experienced, for allowing "New Scott" to shift ground, causing "High Up" (W. Hickey) to be forced on to "Sadini" (R. Parker) at the turn out of the back straight in the last lap.

KENSINGTON FREE-FOR-ALL (First Division)-N. Gath ("Volo Gift") was severely reprimanded for tightening the field when going towards the lead at the turn out of the back straight in the second lap.

IRVING HANDICAP—Warnings were issued to "Erridon (G. Harpley), "Sandy Spring" (G. Rothacker) which began badly, and "Brigadier Wilkes" (L. Hunt) which broke without interference at the first turn.

KENSINGTON FREE-FOR-ALL (Second Division)-An enquiry was held into the reason for "Tacit" (D. Fitzpatrick) breaking at the turn out of the back straight in the last lap. After questioning D. Fitzpatrick, F. Kersley ("Caduceus") and L. Hunt ("Young Pedro"), it was established that when "Caduceus," which had been pulling hard throughout, saw an opening between "Mineral Spring" (M. Adams) and "Tacit" which was dropping back beaten, "Caduceus" took the opening quickly, causing "Tacit" to be checked, and to break. The Stewards were satisfied that Kersley was powerless to prevent "Caduceus" taking this opening, and no further action was taken.

STEWARDS' REPORT-Continued.

NEWTON STAKES-J. Glasheen ("Gleaming Light") was severely reprimanded for crossing "Jocose" (D. Fitzpatrick), causing that horse to be checked at the first turn. An enquiry was opened into the unseating of F.

Kersley from "Claude's Advice" in the straight in the last lap. This was adjourned until Kersley is fit to give evidence.

KENSINGTON FREE-FOR-ALL (Third Division)-An enquiry was held into the reason for J. Riddell ("Sandy Lu") being unseated in the back straight in the first lap. It was found that when "Gambling Raid" (R. Parker) checked to take an opening on the rails behind the leaders, he was contacted from behind by "Malniri" (M. Adams) which momentarily broke, and fell back on to "Befana Spring" (N. Gath) which in turn contacted "Sandy Lu" unseating Riddell. The occurrence was accidental.

In the back straight in the last lap, "Grand Monarch" (G. Rothacker) stepped on a shoe and fell. He met

no interference.

In the second lap, "Befana Spring" (N. Gath) broke when checked to avoid "Worthy Chief" (D. Hoban) which was crossing to the rails quickly at this stage. Hoban was not available for questioning, and will be contacted at a later date.

TOTALISATOR UNCLAIMED DIVIDENDS

Totalisator dividends from the PREVIOUS meet-

ing may be collected at:-

Late Dividend windows in the Paddock "A" and Leger "A" Totalisator houses from one half-hour before the first race until the start of the second race.

Late Dividends from EARLIER meetings may be collected at the offices of Automatic Totalisators Limited, 472 Bourke Street, Melbourne, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. and thereafter each day for a period of one month from date of meeting (Saturdays and Public Holidays excepted).

The barometer-type Totalisator indicator at the eastern end of the track will show odds for a Win (White) and Place (Red), and will not indicate odds beyond 100 to 1.

The projection-type Indicator situated over or near each Totalisator House will show odds for both Win and Place up to 200 to 1. Extreme odds-on will be

indicated by a red spot.

"PLACE" bets are 1, 2, 3 when eight or more horses remain in a race when the Totalisator is opened, and 1, 2 when not fewer than five nor more than seven horses remain in when the Totalisator is opened.

The "PLACE" Totalisator will not be opened

when four horses or fewer start in a race.

Warning bells will be rung outside the Totalisator Houses 15 minutes and 5 minutes before each race.

TOTALISATOR REGULATION

No person under the age of 21 years shall be permitted to bet on the Totalisator, vide Section 14 (1) of Totalisator Act, 1930.
