# DOUBLES and QUINELLA TOTALISATOR

- 1. A "Doubles" totalisator will operate on "this and the next" for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Races. A "Quinella" totalisator will operate for the 7th Race.
- 2. Tickets will be issued in denominations of 5/- at windows designated accordingly. They will show the racebook number of the horse in the 1st leg above the racebook number of the horse in the 2nd leg.
- 3. In selecting a "Double" the investor must ask for the racebook number of the horse required in the 1st leg First and then the racebook number of the horse reauired in the 2nd leg.
- 4. An investor may invest in a "Double" as many times as desired. For example, if he wishes to Couple Nos. 3 and 7 more than once he should say "Nos. 3 and 7. two tickets," or whatever number of times he requires the double.
- 5. FIELD BETTING-

Certain windows will be set aside for Doubles "Field" betting. In "Field" betting an investor selects one horse in any one leg of a "Double" with ALL the runners in the other leg. For example, a horse, say No. 7, in the 1st leg, could be coupled with all the horses (the "Field") in the 2nd leg, in which case the investor would ask for "No. 7 and the Field," or the investor may desire to have all runners (the "Field") in the 1st leg coupled with a horse, say No. 5, in the 2nd leg, in which case he would ask for "the Field and No. 5." Of course, the investor's outlay is greater, being governed by the number of horses in "the Field." A "Doubles" ticket in "Field" betting can be issued just as quickly as a "Doubles" ticket for a combination of only two horses.

- 6. In Totalisator Doubles you are entitled to A REFUND OF YOUR STAKE in the following circumstances—
  - (a) If your FIRST horse is scratched or withdrawn regardless of whether your second horse wins or does not start.
  - (b) If your SECOND horse is scratched or withdrawn BEFORE your first horse starts, regardless of whether your first horse wins or loses.

(c) If your FIRST horse wins and your second horse is scratched or withdrawn after the running of the race in which your first horse was a starter.

NO REFUND is made if your first horse loses and your second horse is scratched or withdrawn after the running of the race in which your first horse started.

7. QUINELLA (RACE PAIRS) BETTING-

This is a form of "Doubles" betting on any one race. Unless otherwise announced, it will operate on THE LAST RACE ONLY. Where a "Quinella" operates the investor may select any two horses in the race. for example, Nos. 3 and 11, and if those horses fill the first two placings, IRRESPECTIVE OF WHETHER THEY ARE PLACED FIRST AND SECOND OR SECOND AND FIRST, the investors on Nos. 3 and 11 are entitled to collect the dividend declared on the "Quinella." "Quinella" tickets may be obtained at all "Doubles" windows.

### WARNING TO PATRONS OF DOUBLES and QUINELLA TOTALISATORS

#### STEWARDS' REPORT

MEETING, 21st FEBRUARY, 1959

ADDINGTON HANDICAP—As no driver had been declared for "Gaillard Direct" and the horse was not on the course, it was withdrawn by the Stewards at 6.41 n.m.

"Poinciana" (W. Hickey) which began badly, and broke twice in running, was pulled up in the second last lap. W. Hickey was notified that a better performance was expected from this horse in future. "Summer Van" (G. Gath) began slowly.

INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP — 1st Qualifying Division—First Heat—As no drivers had been declared for "Billabong Scott," "Percy's Elect" and "Noble Western" and the horses were not on the course, they were withdrawn by the Stewards at 6.41 p.m.

At the request of the Stewards, the Board's Veterinary Surgeon examined "Flare Alley" prior to the race, and declared the horse fit to race.

"Gold Indian" (P. Wells) which reared when lining up at the start, got its front legs entangled in the sulky of "First Division" (G. D. Wilson). This delayed the race for some minutes. In future heats, "Gold Indian" will be drawn wide.

"First Division" (G. D. Wilson) suffered a check at the start, between "Apparently" (B. Bastin) and

"Maori Hall" (C. Allen).

INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP — 1st Qualifying Division—Second Heat—An enquiry was held into the reason for "Vapour Trail" (I. Lawrance) breaking at the turn out of the back straight in the second lap. It was found to be caused by "Vapour Trail" shifting ground as "Imperial Robert" (L. Orwin) made a run, and striking "Erridon's" (G. Harpley) sulky.

An enquiry was also held into the reason for "Whispering" (G. Rothacker) and "Yapour Trail" (J. Lawrance) being pulled up at the turn out of the straight in the last lap. It was established that again in shifting ground, "Vapour Trail" (J. Lawrance), put his foot through the sulky of "Whispering," causing that horse to pull up. It was considered that Lawrance had driven carelessly on both occasions, and his driver's licence was suspended for four weeks. "Yolo Gift" (N. Gath) broke at the start.

VICTORIAN HAMBLETONIAN TROTTERS' CHAM-PIONSHIP—The nomination of "Ulverstone" (L. Welsh) which broke without interference in the first lap, causing the majority of the field to either break or suffer checks, was refused in the metropolitan area.

#### STEWARDS' REPORT-Continued.

At the Judge's Box in the last lap, "Don't Enquire" (R. Simons) broke without interference, causing "Smart Lulu" (W. Robinson) and "Valley Echo" (D. Ducat) to be seriously checked. A warning was issued to the connections of "Don't Enquire." When "Jenny" (N. Thompson), which was tiring badly at the turn into the straight in the last lap, lugged in, it caused "Carlotta's Pride" (G. Gath) to be checked and break. "Teddy Bear" (H. Stanley) began badly. A warning was issued.

INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP — 1st Qualifying Eivision—Third Heat—"Worthy Chief" (F. Kersley), which began badly, will be drawn wide in the remaining heats.
"Heroic Action" (G. Gath) mixed his gait for a few strides approaching the first turn.

INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP — 1st Qualifying Division—Fourth Heat—"Derive" (G. Rothacker) began slowly.
"Wondrous" (F. Kersley) which delayed the start by rearing and breaking through the barrier, will be drawn wide in the remaining heats.

INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIP — 1st Qualifying Division — Fifth Heat — D. Fitzpatrick was severely reprimanded for attempting to force his way with "Sheffield Globe" from inside "Rich Dale" (G. Rothacker) in the straight with one lap to go.

# **Notice to Totalisator Patrons**

LATE DIVIDENDS from the PREVIOUS meeting may be collected at Late Dividend windows in the Paddock "A" and Leger "A" Totalisator houses from one half-hour before the first race until the start of the second race.

Late Dividends from EARLIER meetings may be collected at the offices of Automatic Totalisators Limited, 472 Bourke Street, Melbourne, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. and thereafter each day for a period of one month from date of meeting (Saturdays and Public Holidays excepted).

ODDS INDICATORS. The barometer-type Totalisator indicator at the eastern end of the track will show odds for a Win (White) and Place (Red), but will not indicate odds beyond 100 to 1.

The projection-type Indicator situated over or near each Totalisator House will show odds for both Win and Place up to 200 to 1. Extreme odds-on will be indicated by a red spot.

PLACE BETTING. "PLACE" bets are 1, 2, 3 when eight or more horses remain in a race when the Totalisator is opened, and 1, 2 when not fewer than five nor more than seven horses remain in when the Totalisator is opened.

The "PLACE" Totalisator will not be opened when four horses or fewer start in a race.

Warning bells will be rung outside the Totalisator Houses 15 minutes and 5 minutes before each race.

MINORS NOT TO BET. No person under the age of 21 years shall be permitted to bet on the Totalisator, vide Section 14 (1) of Totalisator Act, 1930.

#### HORSES MUST BE ATTENDED

#### Rule 236B:

- (i) A horse shall not be left unattended in the Birdcage until it has completed all its racing on the programme.
- (ii) When a horse is left unattended, contrary to the last preceding sub-rule, the owner, trainer and other person for the time being in charge of the horse shall be guilty of an offence against these rules unless he satisfies the stewards that he had taken all reasonable precautions to ensure that a responsible person was constantly in attendance on the horse.
