

GUIDE TO INVESTORS

The large numbers at the top and bottom of each column represent the Horse Numbers.

The numbers in each column are £ symbols, the graduated marks between the numbers being 5/- symbols.

The bottom of the white ribbon indicates the Place Dividend.

The bottom of the yellow ribbon indicates the Win Dividend.


When the yellow ribbon is not visible the Place Dividend is greater than the Win Dividend.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE COMPUTATION OF DIVIDENDS

WIN AND PLACE BETTING

- 1. Any Totalisator Club may operate in accordance with any system authorised by these Regulations, not more than two separate pools on different Totalisators, or parts of a Totalisator, in respect of any race for which the Totalisator may be lawfully opened.
- 2. If the number allotted on the Totalisator shall be four or less the dividend shall be paid on the first horse only.
- 3. Any such Club may, in respect of any race in which the numbers allotted on the Totalisator shall exceed four, operate two pools, in which case it shall pay on one of such pools a dividend on the first horse only and on the other pool (hereinafter referred to as "the place pool") dividends computed in accordance with Regulation 4 hereof.
- 4. In respect of the Place Pool the following provisions shall apply:—
 - (a) The amount available for payment of dividends on the Place Pool shall be divided into as many equal parts as there are horses placed in the dividend bearing places and each such part shall be divided among the investors on one of such horses, notwithstanding that by reason of any dead heat or dead heats the number of such horses shall exceed the number of dividend bearing places.
 - (b) For the purpose of this Regulation horses included in the same bracket and filling dividend bearing places shall be reckoned separately and the sum to be divided among the investors on such bracket shall be the sum of the several amounts allotted to each of such horses;
 - (c) In computing dividends no account shall be taken of any horse on which no tickets shall be taken and in such case the pool shall be divided into as many equal parts as there are horses, on which tickets have been taken, in dividend bearing places.

Provided that where the dividend bearing places are first and second only, and by reason of the operation of this condition there is left in those places not more than one horse in respect of which a dividend can be computed a horse or deadheating horse placed third shall be deemed to be in a dividend bearing place, save that nothing in this proviso shall operate to allot for division between such dead heating horses any greater share of the pool than the amount that would be allotted to one horse running third.

- (d) The dividend bearing places shall be:-
 - Where there are five, six or seven numbers allotted to the Totalisator, first and second places.
 - ii Where there are eight or more numbers allotted on the Totalisator, first, second and third places.
 - iii. Where in respect of a race in divisions the Totalisator is opened once only, first and second places in each division.
- If in any pool the dividend is to be paid on the first horse only, then—
 - (1) The whole of the amount available shall be divided among the investors on the horse or horses placed first.

- (2) If no ticket shall be taken on the horse or horses placed first, the rext placed horse on which tickets have been taken, being no further back than third, shall be deemed for dividend computing purposes to be the first horse.
- 6. If any Club shall operate more than one pool the following conditions shall apply:—
 - (1) Investments shall be received separately for each pool.
- (2) All pools shall be closed simultaneously; and
- (3) Each pool shall both as to investments on the several horses and the total investments be kept separate and distinct.
- 7. If in respect of any pool shall be no horse in respect of which a dividend, computed in accordance with these Regulations, can be paid, or unless the race is to be trotted again. If the race shall be deciated void, the amount paid for each ticket, less the amounts required or permitted by law to be deducted therefrom, shall be refunded.

NOTICE TO RIDERS AND DRIVERS

Any Rider or Driver speaking to any person, with the exception of an official, after leaving Birdcage will be fined.

PAYING OUT

Under the Rules of Trotting, Dividends cannot be paid until five minutes after the finish of any race. This is to allow time for protests. Accordingly, there is no more than 18 minutes between races to collect Dividends from pay-out windows. It is practically impossible for patrons to collect off one race and have time to invest on the next. This conforms to overseas experience. Either have someone else to place investments for you or hold your Dividend-bearing tickets and collect periodically at late Dividend windows.

Doubles Totalisator Regulations, which are as follows:—
The unit of investment on the "First Leg" will be 5/- and tickets of £5, £1, 10/- and 5/- value on the "First Leg" only will be on sale from all the Doubles windows.

Every investor shall select a starter to win the "First Leg." The holder of any ticket on the first horse as defined in the Regulations in the "First Leg" may change such tickets as follows: It tickets, for II, 10/- or 5/- tickets, each of which may be invested on any starter in the "Second Leg." 10/- tickets (a) For a ticket of the same value on any starter in the "Second Leg." or (b) for 5/- tickets each of which may be invested on any starter

in the "Second Leg"—at the Doubles windows. Such windows will be opened after the winner of the "First Leg" has been declared.

If any ticket is purchased on a horse which does not weigh out for, or which is for any reason withdrawn from, the "First Leg" BEFORE the Doubles Totalisator is closed for that race, the holder of a ticket on any such horse shall be entitled at his option to a ticket on any other starter, or to a refund, provided that no ticket shall be exchanged at any time after the Doubles Totalisator closes for the "First Leg." If the horse withdrawn is bracketed with another horse even though the latter horse is a starter the holder of a ticket on the bracket may similarly either exchange his ticket, obtain a refund or retain the ticket.

If any ticket is purchased on a horse which does not weigh out for or which for any reason is withdrawn from the "First Leg" AFTER the Doubles Totalisator is closed for that race and before the Starter declares a start the investment may be refunded on the Stewards' decision. This does not apply to any horse which forms part of a bracket with any horse or horses and which start.

If a horse does not weigh out, or is for any reason with-drawn from the "Second Leg" BEFORE the Doubles Totalisator is closed for that race the holder of a ticket on any such horse must exchange his ticket for a ticket on a starter otherwise he forfeits all claims on the pool unless the withdrawn horse is bracketed with a starter, in which case the holder may exchange or retain the

If any ticket is purchased on a horse which does not weigh out for or which is for any reason withdrawn from the "Second Leg" AFTER the Doubles Totalisator is closed for that race and before the starter declares a start for that race if the horse is bracketed with another or others the investment will remain on the other horse or horses in the bracket but if it is not bracketed all ON COURSE investments on the Doubles Totalisator will be transferred to the ON COURSE FAVOURITE as determined by the Stewards in accordance with regulations under the Rules of Trotting and by reference to investments made ON COURSE only. In accordance with the Rules of Totalisator Agency Board OFF COURSE investments will be transferred to the OFF COURSE FAVOURITE. The ON COURSE FAVOURITE may be a different horse to the OFF COURSE FAVOURITE.

In the event of a dead-heat for first place in the "First Race" the pool will be divided into as many equal parts as there are horses dead-heating. Should two starters dead-heat for first place the two pools will be known as "A POOL" for the lower numbered horse and "B POOL" for the higher numbered horse. Separate windows will be provided for "A POOL" and "B POOL" tickets.

Special information relating to the Double will be displayed on the notice board located on the Totalisator building. Similar information will be broadcast.

Patrons are especially warned against destroying their tickets on the Double until the dividend has been declared.

REGULATIONS

(Under Section 33 of the Gaming Act 1908)

(N.Z. Gazette, 8th October, 1959, No. 61, page 1452).

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the "New Zealand Gazette."

2. In these regulations the words "Bookmaker," "Racing Club," and "Race Meeting" shall have the meaning ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the "Gaming Act 1908."

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described or any other racecourse while the same is used or occupied by the said Club for a race meeting,

(a) Bookmakers.

(b) Bookmakers' Clerks, Bookmakers' Assistants and Bookmakers'

Agents.

(c) All persons under disqualification imposed under the New Zealand Rules of Racing or the New Zealand Rules of Trotting or by the Racing or Trotting authorities in any country outside New Zealand which have reciprocal agreements in matters of racing or trotting with the New Zealand Racing Conference or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.

the New Zealand Trotting Conference.

(d) Common prostitutes, idle and disorderly persons within the meaning of the "Police Offences Act 1927."

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house breaking, burglary or pocket picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief assemble or any offence or any live under the mischlef, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the "Crimes Act 1908" and persons convicted under the "Police Offences Act 1927" of conversion or attempted conversion of a motor car or other vehicle or of being idle and disorderly persons or of being a rogue and vagabond and persons convicted of an offence under the "Gaming Act 1908" or persons having a criminal record in countries outside New Zealand and the references to the foregoing Acts shall be deemed to apply to any subsequent Act consolidating or in substitution thereof.

Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Trotting Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to the character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person and without assigning any reason for
