





STEWARDS' REPORT

WAYVILLE - SATURDAY, 22nd FEBRUARY, 1969

Permission granted for use of tube spreader on BOLD AS BRASS.

NEVADA'S SON was given permission to use a telescopic lugging pole.

The Chairman of Stewards wish to bring to notice of all contenders in the Inter-Dominion that a routine swab will be taken of all place-getters.

Christchurch Handicap:

The Stewards questioned R. Cameron (CANDID) as to the reason why he came out so early in the race when they considered he had no need to. It was the opinion of the Stewards this did not improve the horse's chance of winning. Cameron stated that as the horse was driving awkwardly he would take the opportunity while he had it so that he would not inconvenience other horses in the race. He stated he knew he had moved a little too soon. Explanation accepted.

C. Martin (STAR ADMIRER) was questioned as to the horse's slow get away and its poor performance compared with a last start winner. Martin stated that his horse was a little piggish at the barrier and failed to leave the mark cleanly. Martin was informed that the Stewards viewed with great concern that the horse did not perform up to its last start.

R. Laintoll (MERCHANT'S BEST) was also questioned why he made a forward move so early in the race when he appeared to have a good position. Laintoll stated that his horse had started to run about and he was afraid of contacting the gig in front of him so he pulled out to a more forward position to avoid this. Explanation accepted,

It was noted by the Stewards that SWAMP FOX (S. Dyson) appeared to jump just after the turn into the straight in the first lap. Dyson stated that he couldn't give any reason but it appeared that he jumped something on the track.

The Stewards questioned W. Butterworth (TRESCO) as to why the horse went away badly. Butterworth stated that the horse in front of him went away slowly and TRESCO had to check and the horse went out of his gear. Explanation accepted.

Ninth Qualifying Race:

The Stewards questioned P. Coulson (THE ROGUE) in reference to the reason why the horse broke on the turn coming into the straight with one lap to go. Coulson stated that the horse received no interference and broke of his own accord.

It was noted by the Stewards that BOLD DAVID missed the

start.

South Australian Oaks:

The Club Veterinary Surgeon inspected MY GAL SAL after the running of the Oaks and at the request of the owner (Mr. L. Head) a swab was taken from this filly.

It was noted that KILLARA BELLE and JENNY MAC collided with each other and in the opinion of the Stewards this incident was unavoidable.

It was also noted that BOLD AS BRASS and EMPIRE LINE both collided at the start and it was considered accidental.

The Stewards questioned R. Parker (SCOTCH SET) as to why his horse was slow to begin. He stated that MACUSHLA MAC momentarily stepped back causing his horse to be checked. Explanation accepted.

Tenth Qualifying Race:

- J. Schrader (PETER PATRICK) and N. Gath (JEAN PIERRE) were questioned in reference to an incident at barrier rise when it was observed by the Stewards that JEAN PIERRE went out awkwardly causing some inconvenience to PETER PATRICK. N. Gath (JEAN PIERRE) and H. Pullen were questioned in reference to an incident in the straight when it did appear that JEAN PIERRE had come out very quickly when GOLDEN ALLEY went to make its run but it did appear that Gath pulled off MOON-STONE BAY who was tiring and this aggravated the incident. No action.
- R. Cameron (TWINKLE HANOVER) was questioned as to why he appeared to embarrass the driver of GOLDEN ALLEY on the turn out of the straight on each occasion. He stated that his horse was pulling hard and he was trying to control him. He wanted to get a run around the field but he was unable to do this and in the second lap he was fortunate to get a run on the rails which got him out of his trouble. Explanation accepted.

Eleventh Qualifying Race:

The Stewards enquired into an incident concerning ASCOT KING (J. Brown) and LORD SETAY (R. Benger) which occurred on the turn out of the back straight in the last lap. It was revealed that Brown's horse had taken the legs of LORD SETAY. The Stewards considered that the incident could have been avoided had Brown not allowed his horse to run in on LORD SETAY which caused this horse to break and lose what chance he had of figuring in the finish. As a result J. Brown's license was suspended for 28 days.

Valiant Free-For-All:

B. Gath (COROP McELWIN) was reprimanded for looking around unnecessarily during the race.

Twelfth Qualifying Race:

L. Sugars (LARADOC) was severely reprimanded for putting undue pressure on R. Fidler (GARRISON CALL) but the driver of GARRISON CALL stated that his horse was finished and dropping back when LARADOC came out.

The Stewards questioned L. Sugars (LARADOC) and G. D. Wilson (GARRY ROWAN) in reference to an incident which occurred on the turn out of the front straight with a lap to go. It was the opinion of the Stewards that Wilson was trying to get out from inside of LARADOC and putting undue pressure give ground and there was no undue pressure in his opinion. G. D. Wilson was told by the Stewards that he had in their opinion put undue pressure on LARADOC. Both drivers were severely reprimanded and informed if they offended again they would be dealt with in a more severe manner.

R. Parker was questioned in reference to the incident in this Three-year-old Race on 19/2/69 when his horse collided with VIVA AMIGO (). Brown). R. Parker stated that he was unable to avoid the collision as he was to close to pull off, this was the cause for him being unseated from his sulky. No action.

ADMISSION OF CHILDREN
