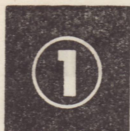

STEWARDS' REPORT

WAYVILLE — FRIDAY, 7th FEBRUARY, 1969

Permission was given to use a running overhead check and a wind-sucking pad on SATIN BERTHA.

At approximately 10 minutes past 7, the trainer of RUBY BRIGADE (W. Heddon) informed the Stewards that L. Fraser who was engaged to drive RUBY BRIGADE, has not arrived. Heddon was given permission to drive in the race.

SMUDGE will be wearing ear plugs, telescopic lugging pole and permission granted for hoppers to be taken up 1½ inches.

Permission granted to use a drop nose band on GOLD MING.

Robert Eden Stakes:

L. Gardiner (RAITINI) was informed his horse would be expected to perform much better at its next start.

The Stewards questioned R. Jacques (SHELETTE MACHINE) and K. Webster (STARINGA) in reference to an incident which occurred after turning out of the back straight coming to the Judge. It was revealed that K. Webster had come out from inside SHELETTE MACHINE, and in so doing had caused slight interference to SHELETTE MACHINE. Jacques stated his horse was dropping back and Webster had room to come out. Webster was reprimanded and informed that at no time must he put undue pressure on anybody.

FAN'S GIRL and GOLDEN GRANITE were both interfered with at the start by the reason that RAITINI had gone away badly.

It was noted that OLD ROCKY broke during the running of the race for no apparent reason. No action was taken.

L. Fraser was later questioned as to the reason why he was late for his engagement to drive RUBY BRIGADE. Fraser informed the Stewards that the car had a breakdown at Bolivar and he was unable to contact the Stewards. Explanations accepted.

Dale's Gift Handicap:

SMUDGE (G. Keightley) and MISTER HALL (A. Foster) were both slow away. They were informed that improvement was expected, or else they would not be selected in future.

Tactile Free-For-All:

SATIN BERTHA (G. Keightley) was withdrawn for unruly behaviour. She threw herself down in the parade ring and then again on the track. Stewards considered the mare's behaviour would be detrimental to other runners, therefore was withdrawn.

R. Cox (FICKLE BOY) was told to inform the connections that this horse would be expected to perform much better in future races or it would not be accepted at Wayville.

As a result of further enquiry into SATIN BERTHA'S behaviour, Routley was informed that the horse would not be accepted for 28 days and he was also fined the sum of \$10 for causing the horse undue suffering with ill-fitting gear.

Royal Dollar Handicap:

G. D. Wilson (PRINCESS AVIAN) was reprimanded for allowing his horse to come out awkwardly from No. 1 barrier causing INSIST (L. Boulter) to check.

NOBLE RIB contacted the offside wheel of KAYDALE'S gig causing it to be punctured. Immediately Sweet pulled off KAYDALE, L. Boulter (INSIST), moved up to the back of KAYDALE and NOBLE RIB momentarily came back again and Boulter had to check. Sweet was informed that he could not occupy two positions at once.

The Stewards enquired into an incident which occurred in the back straight, concerning INSIST (L. Boulter) and KAYDALE (P. Marshall). It was revealed that P. Marshall had momentarily moved out causing INSIST to check. P. Marshall was informed that he could not occupy two positions at once.

South Australian Pacing Derby:

K. Raw owner-driver of GRAND GLENFERN was questioned as to the reason why he appeared to run into a dead end just prior to turning into the straight coming to the Judge. K. Raw stated there was plenty of room and he anticipated being able to go around the two horses in the straight, but immediately he got there the leaders appeared to slow he was in a pocket and could not get out. This explanation was accepted. K. Raw was also fined \$10 for failing to produce his licence before the race.

S. Messenger (ANOTHER RED) was questioned in reference to an incident in which he caused interference to EMPIRE BOY (L. C. Post), GRAND GLENFERN (K. Raw) and GREENWALD (E. Jennings). Messenger was informed that a similar behaviour by the horse would be taken more seriously. He was informed to correct the fault as it was revealed that he veered out and then back again.

John Craig Free-For-All:

L. Sugars (LARADOC) was reprimanded for slight interference to BON ADIOS which in turn checked GOLDEN ALLEY slightly. No action.

PALPITATE, who had received an injury during the week, was inspected by the Veterinary Surgeon, and was found to be unfit to take his place in the John Craig Free-For-All, and had to be withdrawn.

September Flight Handicap:

The connections of STAR ADMIRER (C. Martin) and JEFFREY (R. A. Glasgow) were informed that these horses would be expected to leave the barrier much cleaner in future races or otherwise action would be taken.

It was noted that HALF CROWN (K. Brook) dropped a hobble near the winning post the first time and then stepped out of the hobble and had to be pulled up. The gear was of good quality.

The Stewards resumed the adjourned enquiry into the false start in the last race on Friday, 31st January, 1969. After taking evidence from all barrier attendants and Mr. Hanrahan, also Mr. Hann, it was the opinion of the Stewards that Mr. Hann had not given sufficient warning to Mr. Buck before getting out of his gig. Therefore he was fined \$10.

Veterinary Surgeon inspected GLEAMING GIRL after the John Craig Free-For-All. He informed the Chairman of Stewards that a cardio-graph of the horse would be taken on Sunday or Monday morning. The Stewards will be informed immediately of the result.
