





STEWARDS' REPORT

WAYVILLE - WEDNESDAY, 19th FEBRUARY, 1969

Auckland Stakes:

J. May (HIGH ADIOS) was informed this horse would not be selected at Wayville until he showed he would leave the barrier cleanly.

A protest was lodged by R. Shelbourn (AACHTENAN) against MISDERMEANY (C. Martin) on the grounds of interference on the first turn out of the straight in the first lap. After taking evidence and from the observations of the Stewards the protest was upheld.

M. Hearl (OLD ROCKY) was severely reprimanded for colliding with EMPIRIC'S PRINCESS just after the winning post at the finish of the race. He was informed that at all times he must take care when pulling up.

OLD ROCKY (M. Hearl) severely interfered with RAEMAUR LASS (S. Messenger) at barrier rise. M. Hearl was told to cure the horse of this habit.

Fifth Qualifying Race:

The Stewards enquired into an incident concerning GOLD MING (W. Harradine) and GYRO (K. Murray). It was revealed that GOLD MING was lugging very badly and was causing Harradine a great amount of inconvenience to keep him straight. Harradine stated he did not receive any interference from the horse inside or from the outside. He contributed the break to the fact that the horse had hit himself badly.
The driver of TEENY RENA (B. Hancock) had driven with his

foot out of the rest and he was informed that any further incident of this nature would be severely dealt with.

Brisbane Stakes:

VIVA AMIGO (J. Brown) which went away a few strides and reared in the air, came down and contacted LUCKY CHILD (L. Kelsall) which, in turn, contacted SCOTCH SET (R. Parker) causing Parker to be unseated, and a few yards further on SCOTCH SET fell on the track after tangling its gear. In the second lap BRILL fell and other horses contacted the back of BRILL causing the following horses to be put out of the race—ADVANCING, KILLARA BELLE. ANOTHER RED, which momentarily fell and regained his feet, continued on in the

Brown was questioned in reference to the incident and he informed the Stewards that he was unable to give any explanation as the horse had always gone away well and had won his last four races. The Stewards informed Brown if the horse was racing here in the future it would be expected to perform in a much better manner.

Sixth Qualifying Race:

The Stewards enquired into an incident concerning G. D. WIIson (PRINCESS AVIAN), K. Webster (BYLAW), K. Murray (GARRISON CALL). During the course of the evidence it was revealed that the horse was on the outside of PRINCES AVIAN when the incident happened and inconvenienced Wilson who heard Mr. Webster call but he was unable to give him any more room. It was revealed that the incident was aggravated by all drivers trying to take up a position early in the race. It was considered a race incident and no action was taken.

A Lewis (GLEAMING GIRL) was fined \$20 for Interference

to PETER PATRICK during the running of the race.

Seventh Qualifying Race:

CORALE OAKS (K. Newman) went away slowly and took practically no part in the race. The Stewards questioned Newman as to CORALE OAKS behaviour and he stated the horse had never missed so badly before and had always gone away reasonably well. He would do all in his power to see that the

horse went away better at its next start.

In the back straight with 1½ laps to go ASCOT KING (J. Brown) forced FAIR DEED to give ground. R. Perry driver of FAIR DEED claimed he was not inconvenienced and the Stew-

ards took no further action.

West End Pace:

L. Sugars (BOLD JOHN) was informed that this horse would be expected to show by trials that he would go away more cleanly before being accepted at Wayville.

KAY DALE (P. Marshall) broke his hopples and it was re-

vealed that this gear was in good condition.

Adjourned inquiry 15th February.

The Stewards enquired into an incident which occured on the apex of the turn out of the front straight in the first lap when J. May (GOLDEN POINT) was unseated from his gig. R. Vile (FIELD COMMOTION) and K. Webster (BETTER BOY) were questioned in reference to the incident. It was considered this was a race incident which was aggravated by all horses negotiating the turn. The Stewards considered that J. May had partly contributed to the incident himself as his near side wheels were almost on FIELD COMMOTION'S hind quarters.

The Stewards continued their adjourned enquiry, dated 15th February, 1969, into an incident concerning SMART FANCY (F. Wilkins) and BON ADIOS (W. Shinn). After taking evidence from both drivers and on the observations of the Stewards it

was considered that SMART FANCY'S off hind foot had clipped the wheel of BON ADIOS' gig causing Shinn to be tipped out but there was no evidence confirming that SMART FANCY had moved out causing the incident. F. Wilkins stated that his horse never shifted ground at any time he was following BYLAW and Mr. Shinn stated that he was unable to give any information as the incident happened too quickly. Eighth Qualifying Race:

A protest was lodged by J. Schrader driver of MASTER CLAN against TWINKLE HANOVER (R. Cameron) being declared the winner on the grounds of interference in the straight on the first lap. The Stewards considered the grounds of the protest but agreed that TWINKLE HANOVER did not severely check

MASTER CLAN, therefore the protest was dismissed.

TRANSFER OF WINNING HORSES

Winners of penalty-bearing classes will be transferred to the next fastest class on the following meeting, PROVIDED such horses are nominated for such meeting. Where any owner or trainer does not wish to take advantage of the transfer, Secretary should be notified BY NOT LATER THAN 10.30 p.m. on the night of the meeting at which the horse wins. It will then be re-handicapped in the same class in which it won, or scratched for the meeting to which transfer would have been made. Note—Automatic transfer to a Discretionary class will not be effected.
