CONDITIONS

The Selling Windows for the On-Course Double will open at 5.45 p.m. and the Second Double at the conclusion of the Third Race.

Double Tickets at \$10, \$2 and \$1 each may be purchased at the Main Double Totalisator, and at \$2 and \$1 each from the booth on the ground floor of the Public Stand.

The Double Totalisator shall be conducted so that there shall be a separate pool from the pool of any other Totalisator operating on one race only.

The Selling Windows for the Double will close simultaneously with the Win and Place Totalisator operating on the first race of the Double and the second race of the Double.

Tickets for the Double will be sold for the horse chosen to win the first race of the Double up to the time of the closing of the Totalisator for that Race.

Holders of winning tickets on the First Leg must change their tickets for the horse or horses they wish to support for the second race of the Double.

HOLDERS OF \$10, \$2 and \$1 WINNING TICKETS ON THE FIRST LEG OF THE DOUBLE MAY CHANGE THEM FOR \$1, or 50c TICKETS ON THE SECOND LEG.

Investors failing to change their winning tickets on the First Race of the Double before the Double Totalisator closes for the Second Race of the Double shall have no further interest or claim in or upon any amount invested and shall not be entitled to any refund.

If there be a dead-heat the right of holders of tickets on the Starters so dead-heating shall be determined in accordance with the regulations.

If any ticket is purchased on a horse which does not weigh out for, or which is for any reason withdrawn from, the "First Leg" BEFORE the Double Totalisator is closed for that race, the holder of a ticket on any such horse shall be entitled at his option to a ticket on any other starter, or to a refund, provided that no ticket shall be exchanged at any time after the Double Totalisator closes for the "First Leg". If the horse withdrawn is bracketed with another horse even though the latter is a starter the holder of a ticket on the bracket may similarly either exchange his ticket, obtain a refund or retain his ticket.

If any ticket is purchased on a horse which does not weigh out for, or which is for any reason withdrawn from, the "First Leg" AFTER the Double Totalisator is closed for that race and before the Starter declares a start the investment may be refunded on the Stewards' decision. This does not apply to any horse which forms part of a bracket with any horse or horses which start.

If a horse which is not part of a bracket does not weigh out, or is for any reason withdrawn from the "Second Leg" after the "First Leg" has been run, and before the Starter has declared a start in the "Second Leg", the Stewards shall order that all investments remaining on that horse on the Double Totalisator at the time the Totalisator closes for the "Second Leg" shall be placed on the favourite for such race as determined by that part of the investments on the Double Totalisator on course for starters in the "Second Leg" and ascertained after the closing of the Double Totalisator on the "Second Leg" and as recorded before this adjustment takes place, in accordance with the regulations under the Rules of Trotting. In accordance with the Rules of the Totalisator Agency Board OFF COURSE INVESTMENTS will be transferred to the OFF COURSE FAVOURITE. The ON COURSE FAVOURITE may be a different horse from the OFF COURSE FAVOURITE.

If the withdrawn horse is bracketed then the investments will remain on the other horse or horses in the bracket.

Until the Double Totalisator closes for the "Second Leg", a holder of a ticket on a withdrawn horse (whether bracketed or not) has the right to change his ticket for a ticket on a starter.

The Double will be deemed to be void and the amount available for dividend shall be divided equally amongst the holders of tickets on the horse subsequently declared to be the First Horse in the "First Race" or if there are no holders of tickets on the First Horse then in the manner provided in Regulations if:

- (a) In respect of a Double for investors on course only no authority for the payment of a dividend on the First Horse of the "First Race" has been given by the Stewards before the time at which the Totalisator closes for the "Second Race"; or
- (b) In respect of a Double for investors both on and off the course no authority for the payment of a dividend on the First Horse of the "First Race" has been given by the Stewards within 30 minutes before the appointed starting time of the "Second Race".

Any question or dispute arising out of the interpretation of these Regulations, or which is not covered by these Regulations shall be referred to the Committee of the Club whose decision shall be final and binding.

NOTE.—Investments are registered on the DOUBLE Totalisator in units of 50c. Dividends will be shown in units of \$1.

ISSUE OF DOUBLES TICKETS

ON-COURSE CONCESSION DOUBLE

The Selling Windows for this Double will open at 5.45 p.m. when tickets at \$10, \$2 and \$1 each may be purchased at the Main Double Totalisator, and at \$2 and \$1 each from the ground floor of the Public Stand. Winning tickets on the first leg may be redeemed at the same buildings. Payment of dividends on this double will be made from special windows at the rear of the Main Double Totalisator or at the Totalisator on the ground floor of the Public Stand.

SECOND CONCESSION DOUBLE

After the conclusion of the third race tickets at \$10, \$2 and \$1 each on this double may be purchased at the Main Double Totalisator and at \$2 and \$1 from the ground floor of the Public Stand. Winning tickets on the first leg may be redeemed at the same buildings. Payment of dividends on this double will be through the selling windows of all Double booths.

TOTALISATOR INFORMATION

THE TOTALISATOR

WIN POOL—Dividend paid on first horse only.

PLACE POOL—Four or less Totalisator numbers—one pool and one dividend.

FIVE, SIX or SEVEN numbers allotted on the Totalisator—Two dividends, each 50 per cent.

EIGHT or more numbers allotted on the Totalisator—Three dividends each 33 $\frac{1}{3}$ per cent.

Patrons are requested to make their investments early to enable the programme to run to time.

The Public are warned against destroying their Totalisator tickets until the end of the day.

At day meetings the Balloon will be hoisted when the Totalisator closes, and the race will start when the Balloon is lowered. At night meetings Flashing Amber Lights will replace the Balloon.

Investors must tender the Exact Amount of Investments at the selling windows. Special windows are provided for supplying change.

When making investments, investors are requested to state distinctly whether Win or Place tickets are required.

Investors should see that the proper change, ticket, or dividend is received before leaving the window.

In no circumstances will claims for dividends on lost or destroyed totalisator tickets be entertained.

Investments registered on the Win and Place Totalisator are in \$1 units. Dividends will be shown in units of \$1.

NOTICE—Patrons are requested to refuse to purchase tickets or collect dividends for any person outside of the queues leading to the Totalisator windows.

TOTALS AND DIVIDENDS DISPLAYED—Totals and Dividends displayed on the Win and Place Indicators and on the Double Indicators are for combined On-Course and Off-Course Investments.

EARLY INVESTMENT—Patrons are requested to make their double investments early as the Totalisator will be closed punctually.

TOTALISATOR HORSE NUMBERS—Patrons are advised that the Totalisator horse numbers set out in this race book are not necessarily the same numbers as those used as Totalisator Agency Board code numbers.

CLOSING OF TOTALISATOR—Three minutes after the sounding of the intermittent signal over the public address system the Totalisator will close.

PAYMENT OF DIVIDENDS—The late dividend windows for \$50, \$10, \$2 and \$1 tickets on all races will close at the start of the last race.

GENERAL INFORMATION

PHOTO FINISH

When "Photo" appears on the result board, there will be a short delay in posting the placed horses to allow the Judge to inspect a photograph of the finish.

Later, photographs will be exhibited at the west end of the Double Totalisator and the west side of the Members' Stand.

BUGLE CALL

A bugle call will be sounded over the public address system when the field leaves the Birdcage.

LAP BELL

As a warning to drivers the lap bell (situated at the top of the straight) will be sounded when the field has one more round of the track to go.

SIREN

Patrons are advised that a Siren will be sounded if an inquiry is to be held, the result of which might affect the placings of the horses.

ADMISSION: \$1.00

Children under 15 years of age, accompanied by a guardian, will be admitted to the course free of charge.

Under the conditions of the programme the number of horses which will be permitted to start in any race shall not exceed sixteen.

SYDNEY STAKES — SPECIAL CONDITIONS

For THREE-YEAR-OLDS. Winners of one race will be penalised 12 yards. Winners of two or more races will be penalised 24 yards. All other horses will start from scratch. This race will be run as two events.

FORM OF HORSES

The recent performances detailed in this racebook have been specially compiled, but the Club accepts no responsibility for the accuracy of the information given.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIPS

MAXIMUM HANDICAP MARKS:

For both Pacing and Trotting events the maximum handicap marks will be as under:—

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles	— 36 yards behind
1 $\frac{3}{8}$ miles	— 48 yards behind
2 miles	— 48 yards behind

RE-HANDICAPS:

After handicaps have been declared for the Championships events, any horse so handicapped subsequently winning a race at any other meeting in Australia or New Zealand to the value of \$10,000 (in the case of the Trotters' Championship \$4,000) or more to the winner may be re-handicapped for the Championships events. In no case other than above stated will a horse's mark be altered after the declaration of handicaps, errors and omissions excepted.

FIXED HANDICAPS:

Once a horse is handicapped for the Championships no penalty will be incurred in the Grand Finals as a result of any placed performance in a Qualifying Race.

QUALIFYING RACES (or heats of same):

The aim of the Championships Programme Committee is that there will not be more than three heats (in the case of the Trotter's Championship, two heats) in any Qualifying Race and not more than 14 horses in any one heat. The Committee reserves the right to vary these figures. The heats of the Third Qualifying Race for Pacers and the Second Qualifying Race for Trotters will be run under Free-For-All Conditions. Heats of Qualifying Races will be run as separate races and the Totalisator will be open on each heat separately.

Qualifying points for the Championships Grand Finals shall be awarded to each horse actually starting and finishing a race of the Qualifying Divisions on the basis that the winner of a race of a Qualifying Division will receive in points the equivalent of the number of horses previously selected by the New Zealand Metropolitan Trotting Club (Inc.) as the maximum number of horses to compete in each race of the Qualifying Divisions. The second horses in each race of the Qualifying Divisions will receive the next lower number in points and the third horses will receive the next lower number with each horse actually finishing thereafter receiving in order one lower number in points than the preceding horse until the last horse finishing in a maximum field will receive one (1) point.

The winner of each race of a Qualifying Division will receive one (1) bonus point to be added to the points already earned by the winner of that race.

There will be no points awarded for fastest time.

A horse that is scratched from a race of the Qualifying Divisions or a horse that does not complete a race will not be awarded any points for that race.

In the event of a scratching or a horse not completing the course, points will be awarded as before with the winner and other horses finishing the race entitled to receive their maximum number of points as if a full field had competed and finished the course in that particular race. In the event of a dead heat all points of the horses dead heating shall be added together and equally divided among the horses dead heating.

The twelve (12) horses which gain the greatest aggregate of points shall be eligible to start in the Grand Finals, but should circumstances warrant such a course of action the Grand Council of the Inter-Dominion Conference shall have the power to increase the numbers of starters above the designated number and to select the additional starters.

In the event of two or more horses each scoring equally the minimum number of points entitling them to be eligible for the Grand Finals and thereby producing a field exceeding the number designated by the New Zealand Metropolitan Trotting Club (Inc.) or producing a field exceeding the safety number permitted for Addington Raceway, then the Grand Council shall decide in its discretion which of the horses with equal points shall start in the Grand Finals.

The Championships Programme Committee shall be the sole judge of which horses are entitled to start in the Consolation Races.

HORSES ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE IN THE GRAND FINAL:

To be eligible to compete in the Grand Final horses shall start in each Qualifying Race unless exemption is made by the Grand Council who shall decide upon each case according to its merit.

SPECIAL GENERAL CONDITIONS GOVERNING INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIPS

(1) All Races will be run and all proceedings in connection therewith conducted under the New Zealand Rules of Trotting and subject to these conditions and to the Regulations laid down by the Inter-Dominion Trotting Conference.

(2) Subject to the previous consent of the President of the New Zealand Trotting Conference the Committee of the New Zealand Metropolitan Trotting Club (Inc.) will have the right to:—

- Alter the order in which races on any programme are advertised to be run.
- Alter the limit, the stake, or any of the conditions of any of the races.
- Cancel the Championships events in which case all money received will be refunded.
- Cancel the Trotting Championship if insufficient Australian Trotters remain in the field after the First Withdrawal. In this event fresh nominations will be called for a race or races the class of which will be decided upon.
- Increase or decrease the number of Heats in the Qualifying Races or decrease the number of Consolation races and amend the number of other events on the programme to retain a maximum of eight races.

(3) The Committee of the New Zealand Metropolitan Trotting Club (Inc.) reserves the right to reject the nomination of any horse in which case the decision of the Committee will be final and binding on all parties.

(4) The Committee of the New Zealand Metropolitan Trotting Club (Inc.) reserves the right to select the horses to start in the Inter-Dominion Championships.

(5) HANDICAPPING PENALTIES:

- All Qualifying Races (or Heats) and Consolation Races are penalty free in Australia and New Zealand.
- The Winners of the Grand Finals shall be penalised in accordance with the handicapping regulations.

STIPENDIARY STEWARDS' REPORT

NEW ZEALAND METROPOLITAN TROTTING CLUB INC.
INTER-DOMINION CHAMPIONSHIPS, 1971

FIRST NIGHT — SATURDAY, 13th FEBRUARY

Weather: Fine.

Track: Hard and Fast.

Race 1—Inter-Dominion Pacing Championship. First Qualifying Race (First Heat):

HAKIM lost a considerable amount of ground at the start while MANAROA paced for a few strides and then broke, also losing a large stretch of ground.

Race 2—First Graduation Stakes:

HIGH LARK, PIPPO, STROLL AWAY and VAN GLORY made bad beginnings while after approximately a furlong of the journey BACHELOR STAR and POMPAÑO broke. Into the straight for the first time HIGH LARK went into a break again.

Race 3—Inter-Dominion Trotting Championship. First Qualifying Race (First Heat):

PRECOCIOUS failed to go away while after a furlong SALVANDER who was in the lead at this stage went into a bad break. In the run into the judge MERRIN broke with approximately half a furlong to go while RETEP'S PRIDE also broke.

Race 4—Second Graduation Stakes:

GAY ARMBRO, SANTA HANOVER, VERACITY and ZENOVER all lost their chance at the start while GOLDEN GUEST broke hopelessly after approximately half a furlong. HOBART LORD skipped and broke for a few strides at the top of the straight.

Race 5—Inter-Dominion Pacing Championship. First Qualifying Race (Second Heat):

SAM TRYAX, FALSE SQUARE and CHEQUER BOARD failed to go away while JUNIOR'S IMAGE broke after approximately a furlong and a half. FALSE SQUARE again broke during the running of the race with a round to go. An inquiry was held into the breaking of JUNIOR'S IMAGE after approximately 1½ furlongs. The driver of PUN (W. E. Lowe) was found guilty of careless driving and his horseman's licence was suspended until 27th February, 1971 inclusive.

Race 6—Inter-Dominion Trotting Championship. First Qualifying Race (Second Heat):

LE CHAR and MARIUS made bad beginnings and lost large stretches of ground. Into the straight for the first time GOING broke. LE CHAR and GOING broke with approximately 3 furlongs to run while LOGAN PARK left its feet at the top of the straight.

Race 7—Inter-Dominion Pacing Championship. First Qualifying Race (Third Heat):

WAITAKI ELECT stood on the mark and failed to go while MOUNT EDEN and SELWYN HANOVER made bad beginnings. After approximately 1½ furlongs BRAVE REX broke and interfered with TORRENT and TRUE AVERIL.

An enquiry was opened and adjourned until Wednesday night, into an incident that took place between the drivers of MOUNT EDEN and SOMERSET GOLD with approximately 1½ furlongs to run.

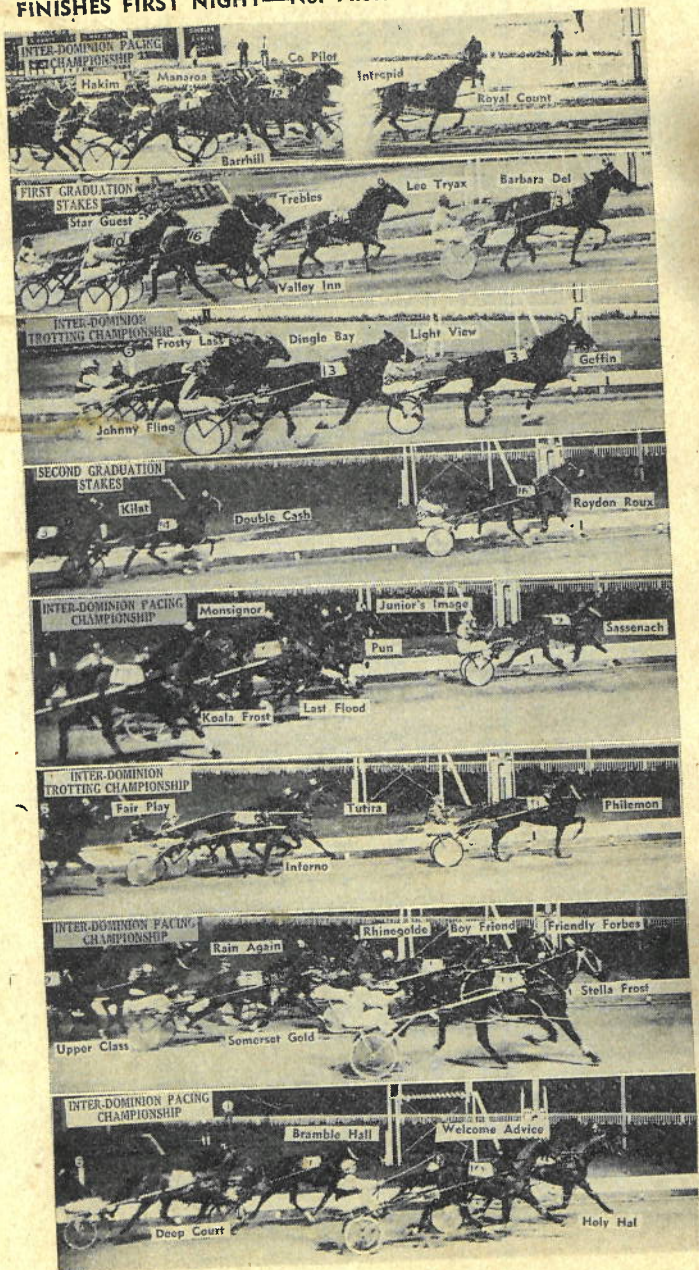
Race 8—Inter-Dominion Pacing Championship. First Qualifying Race (Fourth Heat):

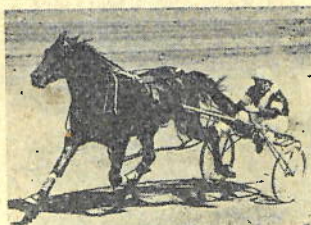

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE COMPUTATION OF DIVIDENDS

1. Any Totalisator Club may operate in accordance with any system authorised by these Regulations, not more than two separate pools on different Totalisators, or parts of a Totalisator, in respect of any race for which the Totalisator may be lawfully opened.

2. If the number allotted on the Totalisator shall be four or less the dividend shall be paid on the first horse only.

3. Any such Club may, in respect of any race in which the numbers allotted on the Totalisator shall exceed four, operate two pools in which case it shall pay on one of such pools a dividend on the first horse only and on the other pool (hereinafter referred to as "the place pool") dividends computed in accordance with Regulation 4 hereof.

4. In respect of the Place Pool the following provision shall apply: (a) The amount available for payment of dividends on the Place Pool shall be divided into as many equal parts as there are horses placed in the dividend bearing places and each such part shall be divided among the investors on one of such horses, notwithstanding that by reason of any dead heat or dead heats, the number of such horses shall exceed the number of dividend bearing places; (b) For the purposes of this regulation horses included in the same bracket and filling dividend bearing places shall be reckoned separately and the sum to be divided among the investors on such bracket shall be the sum of the several amounts allotted to each of such horses; (c) In computing dividends no account shall be taken of any horse on which no tickets shall have been taken and in such case the pool shall be divided into as many equal parts as there are horses, on which tickets have been taken, in dividend bearing places. Provided that where the dividend bearing places are first and second only, and by reason of the operation of this condition there is left in those places not more than one horse in respect of which a dividend can be computed a horse or dead-heating horses placed third shall be deemed to be in a dividend bearing place, save that nothing in this proviso shall operate to allot for division between such dead-heating horses any greater share of the pool than the amount that would be allotted to one horse running third; (d) The dividend bearing places shall be (i) Where there are five, six or seven numbers allotted on the Totalisator, first and second places. (ii) Where there are eight or more numbers allotted on the Totalisator, first, second and third places. (iii) Where in respect of a race in divisions the Totalisator is opened once only, first and second place in each division.

5. If in any pool the dividend is to be paid on the first horse only, then (1) The whole of the amount available shall be divided among the investors on the horse or horses placed first; (2) If no ticket shall be taken on the horse or horses placed first the next placed horse on which tickets have been taken being not further back than third shall be deemed for dividend computing purposes to be the first horse.

6. If any Club shall operate more than one pool the following conditions shall apply: (1) Investments shall be received separately for each pool; (2) All pools shall be closed simultaneously and (3) Each pool shall both as to investments on the several horses and the total investments be kept separate and distinct.

7. If in respect of any pool there shall be no horses in respect of which a dividend computed in accordance with these Regulations, can be paid, or unless the race is to be trotted again, if the race shall be declared void, the amount paid for each ticket, less the amount required or permitted by law to be deducted therefrom, shall be refunded.
