



STEWARDS' REPORT

HAROLD PARK-Tuesday, 27th February, 1973

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP-Thirteenth Heat (9 f. & 170 yds.)-The Club's Veterinary Surgeon reported that when at 6.50 p.m. he examined Glamour Chiefat the request of the Stewards, he was of the opinion that it was fit to race. Although he found nothing amiss with the horse, he again examined it during its preliminary and reported that this inspection confirmed his previous assessment of the horse's condition. On the turn into the home straight on the first occasion, Glamour Chief (R. Robinson), when racing in a forward position, propped, galloped and broke its crup, e. As a result, Australis (K. Bayley) was checked out quickly to avoid colliding with Glamour Chief. This caused Globe Bay (J. Carmichael) to gallop and to veer in sharply despite the efforts of its driver. Globe Bay then collided with Yallara, whose driver, G. Jones, was unseated. Glamour Chief regained its gear quickly, but Australis and Globe Bay lost considerable ground and Yallara took no further part. The Stewards were safisfied that the crupper used on Glamour Chief was in good condition. A warning was issued in respect of Glamour Chief, and permission was given for the horse to again race in a hood. As a result of this incident, Bill's Boy and Rhodonite was also checked and lost ground. Adios Victor (A. Bray) galloped at the start and while galloping veered in and contacted the wheel of Australis. This caused Adios Victor to lose valuable ground. A warning was issued in respect of Adios Victor. Entering the home straight coming to the bell, Australis (K. Bayley) shied from a knee boot that had been dislodged from a runner during an incident in the previous lab.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Fourteenth Heat (9 f. & 170 yds.)—As a result of tight racing on the final turn when a number

of runners were racing abreast, Valencia Bay (K. Robinson) and Princess Light (A. Young) accidentally locked wheels. Princess Light was losing ground at the time and Valencia Bay was finishing on. Both horses were inconvenienced and Valencia Bay finished with a flat tyre. An inquiry was conducted into the performance of Arapaho (J. Smolenski). Throughout the race the horse hung in and would not answer the rein when its driver attempted to follow Welcome Advice when that horse was pulled out to make a run coming to the bell. At no stage did Arapaho appear to race kindly. J. Smolenski could offer no explanation for the horse's performance, but suggested that it had refused to race kindly when it was obliged to take up a position two-wide with no horse racing on the inside. J. Smolenski also assured the Stewards that nothing was amiss with his horse. The Club's Veterinary Surgeon reported that when he examined Arapaho after the race it was in his opinion normal. The horses hopples were checked. J. Smolenski was informed that Arapaho's run had been noted.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Fifteenth Heat (9 f. & 170 vds.)—The Stewards questioned T. Warwick (Yankee Rhythm) on the apparently improved performance of his horse. After taking into consideration that during the previous heats Yankee Rhythm had lost its chances when it had galloped. The Stewards took no action. On the turn into the back straight in the final lap, Local Ayr (V. Frost) fell when its front legs came in contact with the offside wheel of Chase On (R. Birthisel). The evidence of the drivers, the Stewards' observations and the official film were insufficient to determine whether the accident had been caused by Chase On coming out slightly at this point or by V. Frost taking his horse too close to Chase On when pulling out from behind that horse to make a run. In the circumstances, no action was taken.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Sixteenth Heat (9 f. & 170 yds.)—Manaroa (N. Hargraves) galloped shortly after the start, veered in and severely checked Deep Court. Both horses lost considerable ground. A warning was issued and Maranoa will be included in the outside draw in standing start races. The Club's Veterinary Surgeon reported that while the horses were doing their preliminary he noticed that Roscott (L. Lindau) appeared to be very lame in the near foreleg. Upon examination he confirmed his opinion and recommended that the horse be withdrawn. This recommendation was adopted by the Stewards, who withdrew Roscott at 8.53 p.m. The Club's Veterinary Surgeon recommended that a Veterinary Certificate of fitness be submitted before Roscott again races So far as betting was concerned, the Stewards directed that all bets on Roscott be refunded and that win-and-place bets on other runners be subject to a deduction of 5 cents in the dollar.

INTER-DOMINION TROTTING CHAM-PIONSHIP-Grand Final (15 f. & 92 yds.)-An inquiry was conducted into the apparently improved performance of Precocious. Driver J. Carmichael was particularly asked why his horse had finished on strongly to win over 15 furlongs and 92 yards but had failed to finish on over a shorter journey a week earlier. J. Carmichael explained that the mare had apparently been affected by the trip from New Zealand and also by the extremely hot and humid weather in Sydney. He stated that in his opinion this caused the mare to train off slightly after it had raced reasonably well in the first heat of the Championship on 16th February. However, after failing to finish on as well as he expected in the second heat of the Championship. Precocious had settled down and had improved over the week-end. After considering whether the circumstances justified a charge under Rule 308 (i) the Stewards severely

reprimanded J. Carmichael under Rule 214 (iii) for failing to bring to the attention of the Stewards information concerning the condition of his horse. In the back straight in the middle stages, Prince Kid (T. Demmler) left the rails and carried Precocious (J. Carmichael) out of its favourable position to three-wide. For some distance thereafter. J. Carmichael continued to apply pressure to Prince Kid in an attempt to force it back to the rails, but in the meantime another runner had progressed to a position inside Prince Kid, which became extremely cramped for room and repeatedy struck the wheel disc of Precocious before finally galloping and losing considerable ground. T. Demmler and J. Carmichael were charged under Rule 261 and their driving licences were suspended for four weeks. Approaching the turn out of the back straight in the final lap, Lochdale (B. Gath), which was racing two-wide, hung out somewhat under pressure leaving just sufficient room for Finnigan (V. Frost) to leave the rails and progress to a position almost on terms with Lochdale. As the field made the turn, Lochdale came back in again slightly, and despite the appeals of V. Frost, B. Gath failed to make any significant effort to relieve the pressure. As a result, Finnigan was severely cramped for room and galloped. B. Gath was charged under Rule 261 and his driving licence was suspended for four weeks. Vanity Van was inspected prior to the first race by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon, who reported that in his opinion the horse was normal and fit to race.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Eighteenth Heat (9 f. & 170 yds.)—Sling Along (A. D. Turnbull) swung sideways at the start and as a result My Gal Sal was cramped for room and lost ground. A warning was issued in respect of Sling Along. Over the concluding stages, Jason King (O. Glendenning) moved in towards the rails under pressure. As a result Speedy Ben (K.

Murray), which was endeavouring to secure a run, was checked and broke.

INTER-DOMINION TROTTING CHAM-PIONSHIP CONSOLATION (15 f. & 92 yds.)— Bambi (R. Caskey) swung away at the start and lost all chance. In view of a previous warning in respect of this behaviour, Bambi was barred for four weeks from standing starts.

Scratchings.—The following horses were scratched during the Inter-Dominion series and were each barred for 12 weeks:—Arvillette, Imatoff, Bret Armagh, Lord Glen, Bay Foyle, Milden Hall, Red Vicar, Roscott.

Gear Changes Approved.—Glamour Chief—Dolly Varden blinkers instead of hood; Yankee Rhythm—under draw; Lumpy Dean—4 ounce toe weights in front.

SCALE OF DEDUCTIONS.

If a horse is withdrawn after betting has commenced on the course, the Stewards are empowered to order a refund of the bets on that horse. In addition, if they consider that the late withdrawal would have any material effect on the other win-and-place bets made prior to the announcement of the late withdrawal, they may make an order for deductions in accordance with the following scale:—

Patrons are reminded that these deductions apply only to bets made before the announcement of the late withdrawal. Bets made subsequently are unaffected, except in the case of a further late withdrawal.

In the event of a late withdrawal from a race at a meeting at another course, if an appropriate ruling can be obtained, bets may be paid in accordance with the order of the Stewards in charge of such meeting. If no appropriate ruling is available, the Stewards may exercise their powers as described above for local betting.

Totalisator Information.

NO REFUNDS ARE MADE OR DIVIDENDS PAID except upon presentation of a ticket. If the ticket is mutilated or defaced an order for payment by the Stewards may be required.

DO NOT DESTROY your ticket until ALL-CLEAR has been declared.

UNCOLLECTED DIVIDENDS.

Dividends not collected on to-night's races may be collected at AUTOMATIC TOTALISATORS LTD., Room 207, 2nd Floor, Shell House, 2-12 Carrington Street, Sydney, Monday to Friday (Public Holidays excepted), between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., for a period of one month after the Meeting. Alternatively, dividends may be collected at this course next meeting, up to 9 p.m.

In the event of the Committee declaring all investments off, the money invested will be returned to the investors.

Every investor and holder of a ticket shall be deemed to have made herself or himself acquainted with the Rules and Conditions of the Totalisator which are exhibited on the Totalisator Houses, and to have agreed to be bound thereby.

REFUNDS ON LATE WITHDRAWALS.

WIN-AND-PLACE, If a horse is withdrawn or declared a non-starter, moneys invested on it will be returned.

DOUBLES.—If,

- (1) Your horse in the first leg is withdrawn-the moneys will be refunded.
- (2) Your horse in the first leg WINS and your horse in the second leg is withdrawn or declared a non-starter after the Totalisator has opened to receive investments on that double, a dividend will be paid depending upon the number of tickets on the first leg.

NOTE.—As a dividend will be paid on the winner of the first leg as set out in (2) NO REFUND will be made where a horse in the second leg is scratched after the Totalisator has opened to receive investments on that double.

QUINELLAS.—Moneys are refunded if either horse is withdrawn, but investments are not refunded if horse withdrawn is bracketed with another starter.

Rules for Investment on the Totalisator are exhibited on Totalisator Houses in all enclosures.

BETTING WITH BOOKMAKERS INFORMATION FOR PATRONS

Betting with Bookmakers on this course is governed by the Rules of Betting of the New South Wales Trotting Club, and the conduct of betting is governed by the Betting Regulations of the New South Wales Trotting Club.

The following information, which has been extracted from the Betting Rules and Regulations, relates to bets made on the course on the day of the race, and is published to assist patrons. Further or fuller information may be sought from the Betting Supervisors on the course:—

A horse is a starter when it has been called to the barrier by the Starter, provided that it has not been declared a non-starter before All-Clear is declared.

Betting on photo-finishes is prohibited.

Betting one-two (as distinct from Quinella betting) is prohibited.

Bets are void if the race is postponed to another day or is ordered to be re-run on another day.

Dead-heats.—If two or more horses dead-heat for first place, the investor for a win on any horse that has so dead-heated is entitled to be paid the sum of the stakes (i.e., the amount written on the betting ticket) divided by the number of horses dead-heating.

Doubles Betting.—When first-leg horse is withdrawn, the bet is off and the stake returned.

When first-leg horse runs and is beaten, the bet is lost.

When first-leg horse wins and second-leg horse is not a starter, the investor is paid at the first-leg horse's starting price odds declared by the Stewards.

When one horse wins and the other horse deadheats, the investor is entitled to half the sum of the stakes (i.e., half the amount written on the betting ticket).

When both horses dead-heat, the investor is entitled to one-quarter of the sum of the stakes (i.e., one-fourth of the amount written on the betting ticket).

Place Betting.—If there were eight or more horses in the race when the wager was laid, place bets must be paid by the bookmaker on the horses placed first, second and third at the time All-Clear is declared.

If there were five, six or seven horses in the race when the wager was laid, place bets must be paid by the bookmaker on the horses placed first and second at the time All-Clear is declared.

Each-Way Betting.—If there were eight or more horses in the race when the bet was made, place bets must be paid on the first, second and third horses at one-fourth of the odds for the win bet. If there were five, six or seven horses in the race when the bet was made, place bets must be paid on the first and second horses at one-third of the odds for the win bet.

Limited Bets.—In the Paddock enclosure at Harold Park Paceway, a bookmaker, if required by an investor, must lay the odds on offer to an investor's stake of \$40, but is not compellable to lose more than \$600 on any one wager.

The limits in the Leger enclosure at Harold Park Paceway are \$20 and \$300, respectively.

For each-way betting the limits are: Paddock, \$40 each-way and \$800; Leger, \$20 each-way and \$400.


For doubles betting the limits are: Paddock, \$10 and \$800; Leger, \$4 and \$400.

Bookmakers on this course are very strictly controlled by the Club, and are required to conform

to many requirements imposed upon them by several Acts of Parliament and by the Rules and Regulations of this Club. Among other things, they are required to be courteous; to commence betting upon the sounding of a signal five minutes after All-Clear has been notified for the previous race; to display odds for every runner in a race; to settle bets immediately upon the presentation of winning tickets; to write legibly on their betting tickets.

Betting Tickets.—The betting ticket that is given to you by a bookmaker is your documentary evidence of the bet you have made. You are urged to make sure, before leaving the bookmaker, that he has written on the betting ticket sufficient letters to identify the horse on which you have invested and in addition, the sum of the stakes. You are entitled to require a bookmaker to rewrite a ticket which you believe to be illegible or not to represent the bet you claim to have made.

Further, patrons are urged to safeguard their betting tickets, for if they are lost or mislaid it is most difficult for patrons to prove their bets. Naturally, the Club will do everything it can to assist patrons who find themselves in difficulty, but it must be realised that the Club has no obligations in this regard. A satisfactory settlement of these matters is sometimes reached if the investor can remember the bookmaker with whom he bet, the exact details of the wager, and the approximate time when the wager was made. The investor may further assist his claims if he reports to the Betting Supervisor immediately he discovers that he has lost his ticket.
