





STEWARDS' REPORT

ADJOURNED IN QUIRY from HAROLD PARK on 16th FEBRUARY, 1973.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Third Heat.—The Stewards concluded an inquiry into an incident shortly after the start of this race. It was found that Glamour Chief (R. Robinson) began quickly and crossed sharply to the rails, causing Bill Barry and Princess Light to be checked and lose some ground. As there may have been some extenuating circumstances in favour of R. Robinson, he was fined \$20 under Rule 261, but was warned that any future breach of the interference rules could lead to strict action being taken against him.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Seventh Heat (13 f. & 98 yds.)—Early in the race Jason King (O. Glendenning) cast its near hind shoe. Imatoff (K. Innes) galloped shortly after the start and lost considerable ground. After being tailed off thereafter, the horse was retired from the race in the back straight in the middle stages. A warning was issued and the Club's Veterinary Surgeon reported that when he examined Imatoff following the race he found that it had struck itself on the inside of the near fore pastern.

INTER-DOMINION TROTTING CHAM-PIONSHIP—Third Heat (13 f. & 98 yds.)— Shortly after the start, the head check of Jimmy Glenfern (J. Dewhirst) became detached. The gear was inspected. Milden Hall (T. O'Day) broke without interference in the run home. A warning was issued. Lucky Sparkle (D. Dunk) galloped at the start and on several occasions in running. In view of previous warnings, Lucky Sparkle was barred for four weeks.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION: SHIP-Eighth Heat (13 f. & 98 yds.)-An inquiry has been opened into two incidents early in the race involving Gentle's Fingers (K. Hampton) and Pearce's Pick (C. R. Sweeney). An inquiry has been opened into an incident as the field straightened for the run home involving Royal Ascot (A. M. Harrison) and Deep Volo (B. J. Forrester). Commando (J. Binskin) sustained a flat tyre in the back straight in the final lap. Also, Commando, during the race struck and dislodged a shin and tendon boot. In the middle stages, Celevale Van (C. J. Parsons) was striking its knee and, when being balanced by its driver, struck and dislodged a knee boot. In the home straight early in the race, K. Hampton (Gentle's Fingers) left the rails when racing almost head and head with Pearce's Pick (C. R. Sweeney) and carried that horse out of its favourable position, obliging it to race three-wide for some considerable distance. The driving licence of K. Hampton was suspended under Rule 261, In the back straight following this incident, C. R. Sweeney challenged the horse leading the two-wide division and opened a gap behind that horse and in front of Gentle's Fingers. He then attempted to ease back into this gap, but when it became apparent to him that insufficient room existed. he did not persist and returned to a full three-wide position. A Harrison (Royal Ascot) was fined \$20 under Rule 261 for slightly inconveniencing Deep Volo on the home turn at a time when Deep Volo was dropping back.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Ninth Heat (13 f. & 98 yds.)—Lord Glen (W. J. Parnell) had to return to the enclosure for adjustment when it sustained a flat tyre during its preliminary. In the back straight in the middle stages, L. Hendry (Bill Barry) left the rails when racing almost head and head with Globe Bay and

carried that horse from its two-wide position to three-wide, where it was obliged to race for some distance. The driving licence of L. Hendry was suspended for four weeks under Rule 261. On the first turn, Deep Court (C. Webster) galloped without interference and as a result Globe Bay was severely checked and lost considerable ground. A warning was issued in respect of Deep Court. In the home straight approaching the bell, Deep Court (C. Webster) accidentally touched the sulky wheel of Grawlin Gee. This caused Deep Court to gallop momentarily and a tyre of Grawlin Gee to be flattened. Entering the back straight in the final lap, Globe Bay was slightly inconvenienced when Bill Barry (L. Hendry) moved wider on the track to improve its position. After studying the official film, and taking into consideration their own observations and the circumstances involved, the Stewards decided to take no action. The front carrying strap of Grawlin Gee (C. R. Sweeney) snapped after passing the finishing line.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Tenth Heat (13 f. & 98 yds.)—On the turn into the home straight coming to the bell, I. Lee (Rhodonite) left it slightly too late to move from two-wide to three-wide when Robalan (D. Nyhan) was coming from behind. As a result, D. Nyhan was obliged to ease Robalan wider on the track. In the circumstances, I. Lee was fined \$20.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Eleventh Heat (13 f. & 98 yds.)—Scottish Charm (D. Townley) broke at the start and veered out, causing Sling Along and Canu Bay to be slightly checked. Durante (R. Sangalli) sustained a punctured tyre during the race. During the race, Bay Foyle (D. Heath) cast its near hind shoe.

INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPION-SHIP—Twelfth Heat (13 f. & 98 yds.)—Adios Victor (A. Bray) galloped at the start and did not pace for some distance. In the meantime the horse lost considerable ground. A. Bray stated that his horse has always been a faultless beginner and that in his opinion it did not know how to fill its gear. A warning was issued.

INTER-DOMINION TROTTING CHAM-PIONSHIP—Fourth Heat (13 f. & 98 yds.—Bambi (J. Smolenski) swung in the reverse diection at barrier rise and lost considerable ground. A warning was issued. Prince Kid (T. Demmler) broke repeatedly throughout the race, but did not gain ground. A warning was issued and the connections were informed that the horse would be expected to trot more solidly. Also, permission was given for the use of an underdraw on Prince Kid.

The following horses broke and their connections were warned:—(start), Just So, Precocious, Polo Breeze, Falcon Scott, Durante, Scottish Charm, Adios Victor, Yankee Rhythm, Apollo Eleven; (running), Milden Hall, Deep Court, Prince Kid.

SCALE OF DEDUCTIONS.

If a horse is withdrawn after betting has commenced on the course, the Stewards are empowered to order a refund of the bets on that horse. In addition, if they consider that the late withdrawal would have any material effect on the other win-and-place bets made prior to the announcement of the late withdrawal, they may make an order for deductions in accordance with the following scale:—

Patrons are reminded that these deductions apply only to bets made before the announcement of the late withdrawal. Bets made subsequently are unaffected, except in the case of a further late withdrawal.

In the event of a late withdrawal from a race at a meeting at another course, if an appropriate ruling can be obtained, bets may be paid in accordance with the order of the Stewards in charge of such meeting. If no appropriate ruling is available, the Stewards may exercise their powers as described above for local betting.

Totalisator Information.

NO REFUNDS ARE MADE OR DIVIDENDS PAID except upon presentation of a ticket. If the ticket is mutilated or defaced an order for payment by the Stewards may be required.

DO NOT DESTROY your ticket until ALL-CLEAR has been declared.

UNCOLLECTED DIVIDENDS.

Dividends not collected on to-night's races may be collected at AUTOMATIC TOTALISATORS LTD. Room 207, 2nd Floor, Shell House, 2-12 Carrington Street, Sydney, Monday to Friday (Public Holidays excepted), between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., for a period of one month after the Meeting. Alternatively, dividends may be collected at this course next meeting, up to 9 p.m.

In the event of the Committee declaring all investments off, the money invested will be returned to the investors.

Every investor and holder of a ticket shall be deemed to have made herself or himself acquainted with the Rules and Conditions of the Totalisator which are exhibited on the Totalisator Houses, and to have agreed to be bound thereby.

REFUNDS ON LATE WITHDRAWALS.

WIN-AND-PLACE. If a horse is withdrawn or declared a non-starter, moneys invested on it will be returned. DOUBLES.—If.

- (1) Your horse in the first leg is withdrawn the moneys will be refunded.
- (2) Your horse in the first leg WINS and your horse in the second leg is withdrawn or declared a non-starter after the Totalisator has opened to receive investments on that double, a dividend will be paid depending upon the number of tickets on the first leg.

NOTE.—As a dividend will be paid on the winner of the first leg as set out in (2) NO REFUND will be made where a horse in the second leg is scratched after the Totalisator has opened to receive investments on that double.

QUINELLAS.—Moneys are refunded if either horse is withdrawn, but investments are not refunded if horse withdrawn is bracketed with another starter.

BETTING WITH BOOKMAKERS INFORMATION FOR PATRONS

Betting with Bookmakers on this course is governed by the Rules of Betting of the New South Wales Trotting Club, and the conduct of betting is governed by the Betting Regulations of the New South Wales Trotting Club.

The following information, which has been extracted from the Betting Rules and Regulations, relates to bets made on the course on the day of the race, and is published to assist patrons. Further or fuller information may be sought from the Betting Supervisors on the course:—

A horse is a starter when it has been called to the barrier by the Starter, provided that it has not been declared a non-starter before All-Clear is declared.

Betting on photo-finishes is prohibited.

Betting one-two (as distinct from Quinella betting) is prohibited.

Bets are void if the race is postponed to another day or is ordered to be re-run on another day.

Dead-heats.—If two or more horses dead-heat for first place, the investor for a win on any horse that has so dead-heated is entitled to be paid the sum of the stakes (i.e., the amount written on the betting ticket) divided by the number of horses dead-heating.

Doubles Betting.—When first-leg horse is withdrawn, the bet is off and the stake returned.

When first-leg horse runs and is beaten, the bet is lost.

When first-leg horse wins and second-leg horse is not a starter, the investor is paid at the first-leg horse's starting price odds declared by the Stewards.

When one horse wins and the other horse deadheats, the investor is entitled to half the sum of the stakes (i.e., half the amount written on the betting ticket).

When both horses dead-heat, the investor is entitled to one-quarter of the sum of the stakes (i.e., one-fourth of the amount written on the betting ticket).

Place Betting.—If there were eight or more horses in the race when the wager was laid, place bets must be paid by the bookmaker on the horses placed first, second and third at the time All-Clear is declared.

If there were five, six or seven horses in the race when the wager was laid, place bets must be paid by the bookmaker on the horses placed first and second at the time All-Clear is declared.

Each-Way Betting.—If there were eight or more horses in the race when the bet was made, place bets must be paid on the first, second and third horses at one-fourth of the odds for the win bet. If there were five, six or seven horses in the race when the bet was made, place bets must be paid on the first and second horses at one-third of the odds for the win bet.

Limited Bets.—In the Paddock enclosure at Harold Park Paceway, a bookmaker, if required by an investor, must lay the odds on offer to an investor's stake of \$40, but is not compellable to lose more than \$600 on any one wager.

The limits in the Leger enclosure at Harold Park Paceway are \$20 and \$300, respectively.

For each-way betting the limits are: Paddock, \$40 each-way and \$800; Leger, \$20 each-way and \$400.


For doubles betting the limits are: Paddock, \$10 and \$800; Leger, \$4 and \$400.

Bookmakers on this course are very strictly controlled by the Club, and are required to conform

to many requirements imposed upon them by several Acts of Parliament and by the Rules and Regulations of this Club. Among other things, they are required to be courteous; to commence betting upon the sounding of a signal five minutes after All-Clear has been notified for the previous race; to display odds for every runner in a race; to settle bets immediately upon the presentation of winning tickets; to write legibly on their betting tickets.

Betting Tickets.—The betting ticket that is given to you by a bookmaker is your documentary evidence of the bet you have made. You are urged to make sure, before leaving the bookmaker, that he has written on the betting ticket sufficient letters to identify the horse on which you have invested and in addition, the sum of the stakes. You are entitled to require a bookmaker to rewrite a ticket which you believe to be illegible or not to represent the bet you claim to have made.

Further, patrons are urged to safeguard their betting tickets, for if they are lost or mislaid it is most difficult for patrons to prove their bets. Naturally, the Club will do everything it can to assist patrons who find themselves in difficulty, but it must be realised that the Club has no obligations in this regard. A satisfactory settlement of these matters is sometimes reached if the investor can remember the bookmaker with whom he bet, the exact details of the wager, and the approximate time when the wager was made. The investor may further assist his claims if he reports to the Betting Supervisor immediately he discovers that he has lost his ticket.
