



- 3 HIGH CAM: Well placed when race under way, held up for run at critical stage, 3rd R.R. 4th Feb. 2,500m. 12-4 Dillon Story 1st. Worth plenty of thought.
- 4 HIGHLAND CHAMP: In 2nd place for greater part of the journey, made little impression on Noble James in run to judge, 2nd Pinjarra 30th Jan 2,500m. 2-9. Has the ability to give this a shake.
- 5 ZELWRACK: 6th Pinjarra, 30th Jan, 2,500m. Windaree 1st. Prefer others.
- 6 MISS COUTHIE: Involved in mix-up, did not complete course, Pinjarra 30th Jan 2,500 m. Piper John 1st. Worked attractively trials G.P. Tuesday night.
- 7 RYTHM HALL: Scored stylishly after enoying run of race, Pinjarra 30th Jan 2,500 m. 2-10. A most consistent performer.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING 1974 INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPIONSHIP

POINTS SYSTEM:

The Championship will be conducted on the points system which shall be awarded as follows—

Points shall be awarded to each horse actually starting and finishing a race of a Qualifying Division on the basis that the winner of a Qualifying Division will receive in points the equivalent of the number of horses previously selected by the Committee as the maximum number of horses to compete in each Qualifying Division.

The second horse in each Qualifying Division will receive the next lower number in points and the third horse will receive the next lower number with each horse finishing thereafter receiving in order one lower number in points that the preceding horse until the last horse finishing in a maximum field will receive ONE (1) point,

The winner of each Qualifying Division will receive ONE (1) BONUS POINT to be added to the points already earned for that race.

No points will be allocated for fastest time.

A horse that is scratched from a Qualifying Division or a horse that does not complete the race will not be allocated any points for that particular Qualifying Division.

In the event of a horse being scratched or not completing the course, points will be allocated as before with the winner and other horses finishing the race entitled to receive their maximum number of points as if a full field had competed and finished the course in that particular race.

In the event of a dead heat all points of the horses dead heating shall be added together and equally divided.

GRAND FINAL:

The ten (10) horses gaining the greatest number of points in the Qualifying Divisions shall be eligible to compete in the Final of the INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPIONSHIP.

In the event of two or more horses each scoring equally the minimum number of points entitling them to be eligible for the Final and thereby producing a field exceeding the number designated by the Western Australian Trotting Association or producing a field exceeding the safety number for Gloucester Park then the Grand Council shall decide in its discretion which of the horses with equal points shall start in the Final.

- (2) No provision of paragraphs (g) or (h):
 - (a) affects the discretion of the Stewards to declare all bets off in special circumstances:

RICHMOND RACEWAY - MONDAY, FEBRUARY 4, 1974

RACE 1: SWEET AGAIN (J. Schrader began badly losing considerable ground. This horse will not be drawn on the rails in future. LUCKY ROBYN (W. T. Groves) began badly and will continue to be excluded from the parrier draw, howeve repetition will result in other action being taken. The connections of CURL'S IDOL (L. J. Robinson) were questioned regarding the inconsistent pattern of racing of this pacer. They were unable to give an acceptable explanation and the nomination of this pacer was refused for 28 days during which time it must show by trials that it is capable of racing consistently. At the turn into the front straight in the bell lap, POSTLE (T. Thompson) which was pulling hard struck the wheel of HIGH CAM (W. Whitfield) and broke severely checking JIDALUK JUNIOR (W. Prentice). Accidental, no action. NOBLE BYRD (C. Norman) was checked by those horses which began badly.

RACE 2: CRUSADER GAY was withdrawn by order of the Stewards following erratic barrier manners at Pinjarra on 30/1/74. COLOUR KID (A. Sangalli) began badly, warned, R. W. KEYS (Blue Aud) was fined \$20 for having forced BANKSY BUTLER (J. Flynn) to cover unnecessary ground in the early stages of the race. BANKSY BUTLER (J. Flynn) missed

WILLIAMS (Lord Alex) was suspended from driving in races for four metropolitan meetings for causing avoidable interference to BIG CAPRI (L. Ferguson) at the turn into the back straight on the first occasion causing that horse and several of the following horses to be severely checked. A. R. JOHNSTON (Lawndarme) was suspended from driving in races for 4 metropolitan meetings for causing avoidable Interference to KIWI RAIDER (L. Groves) at the winning post the second time. REGAL FLAME (W. Bourne) again began badly and was stood down from racing for 28 days, W. BOURNE (Regal Flame) and G. WALLRODT (Priory Dillon) were reprimanded for mistaking the laps.

RACE 5: A routine swab was taken from the winner WEE CENT (L. Lindau. ROYAL FORCE (J. Retzlaff) began badly causing DAINTY'S DAUGHTER (B. Cushing) to be checked. L. AUSTIN (Leytrue) was severely reprimanded for trailing a wheel on several occasions during the race causing HADDOCK (L. J. Robinson) to be inconvenienced. L. AUSTIN was informed that repetition would result in stronger action

RACE 6: GOLDEN DREAMER (D. Walton) began badly, warned. DANNY (A. Torrent) again failed to race competitively and the nomination of this pacer was refused in the metropolitan area, J. OWENS (Holdown) was instructed to allow more room when accepting a position in future as he caused his own horse to be slightly checked in the first lap.

RACE 7: A protest by the third horse EBONY ROCK (G. Lilleyman) against the winner ROYAL VANCE (B. Cushing) for alleged Interference at the turn into the front straight the last time was dismissed after taking evidence from the drivers concerned and the Stewards acting on their own observations. At the turn into the straight EBONY ROCK (G. Lilleyman) was slightly checked when LIGHT BADGE (R. Buswell) shifted off the rails slightly contributing to the incident. The nomination of DUSTY DILLON (L. Austin) which tired badly again causing several horses to be severely checked was refused in the metropolitan area.

NOTICE TO PATRONS

CONDITIONS OF RACING

All races to be run under the Rules of Racing made under the Constitution and Rules of the Western Australian Trotting Association. in all races when two or more horses are on identical marks, the horse whose name appears first will occupy No. 1 pole position, the other positions following in rotation.

REFUSAL OF NOMINATION

The Committee may, in its absolute discretion, at any time after receipt of a nomination, cancel the same without giving any reason therefor. RE-HANDICAPPING OF HORSES

If, after the handicaps are declared for a race a horse wins or le placed in another race, the handicap of that horse may be re-adjusted by the Handicapper.

STARTING Horses are under the starter's orders after the whistle has been blown to take their positions at the barriers.

PROTESTS A driver of a competing horse placed 1st to 5th inclusive, may protest against the winner, or any placed horse on the grounds of interference, crossing, jostling, or any improper act or conduct of the driver of such horse. The protest must be made to a Steward BEFORE THE DRIVER LEAVES THE TRACK AND PRIOR TO ALL CLEAR BEING DECLARED.

BOOKMAKERS

The public is notified that Bookmakers must set the investor up to \$500 on the price shown on the Board until the sounding of the horn calling the horses to the barrier (approximately 3 minutes to the start of each race), after which time the limit of liability shall be \$200.

In the event of a dead heat, payment will be made on a basis of half

the value of the ticket.

On all Betting tickets issued by Bookmakers the name of the Horse and the amount of the Bet must be clearly written. Should a dispute arise and it is found that this has not been done, a decision may be given against the Bookmaker.

Investors must check their tickets for the correct Name of Horse and

Amount, as no claim will be recognised after the acceptance of the

All credit bets must be confirmed by the investor with the Bookmaker concerned, prior to the start of the race.

No person other than the Bookmaker, or his Employee shall be upon the Betting Stand of that Bookmaker.

LOST BETTING TICKETS Assistance by the Stewards in recovering bets made on the course, can only be afforded to patrons who have lost their betting tickets if they can name the bookmaker.


