

CONDITIONS GOVERNING 1974 INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPIONSHIP

POINTS SYSTEM:

The Championship will be conducted on the points system which shall be awarded as follows—

Peints shall be awarded to each horse actually starting and finishing a race of a Qualifying Division on the basis that the winner of a Qualifying Division will receive in points the equivalent of the number of horses previously selected by the Committee as the maximum number of horses to compete in each Qualifying Division.

The second horse in each Qualifying Division will receive the next lower number in points and the third horse will receive the next lower number with each horse finishing thereafter receiving in order one lower number in points that the preceding horse until the last horse finishing in a maximum field will receive ONE (1) point.

The winner of each Qualifying Division will receive ONE (1) BONUS POINT to be added to the points already earned for that race.

No points will be allocated for fastest time.

A horse that is scratched from a Qualifying Division or a horse that does not complete the race will not be allocated any points for that particular Qualifying Division.

In the event of a horse being scratched or not completing the course, points will be allocated as before with the winner and other horses finishing the race entitled to receive their maximum number of points as if a full field had competed and finished the course in that particular race.

In the event of a dead heat all points of the horses dead heating shall be added together and equally divided.

GRAND FINAL:

The ten (10) horses gaining the greatest number of points in the Qualifying Divisions shall be eligible to compete in the Final of the INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPIONSHIP.

In the event of two or more horses each scoring equally the minimum number of points entitling them to be eligible for the Final and thereby producing a field exceeding the number designated by the Western Australian Trotting Association or producing a field exceeding the safety number for Gloucester Park then the Grand Council shall decide in its discretion which of the horses with equal points shall start in the Final.

 - If there is sufficient time: declare off all bets on the remaining horses and order that betting on the race shall be re-opened or
 - If there is insufficient time to re-open betting, declare that all bets on the remaining horses shall be settled at Totalisator odds.
- (2) No provision of paragraphs (g) or (h):
 - (a) affects the discretion of the Stewards to declare all bets off in special circumstances:
- (b) prevents a bookmaker from laying odds against a horse in a race, after the Stewards order or permit the withdrawal from the race of any other horse;
- (k) If, In the opinion of the Stewards, a horse has been prevented from starting by a mechanical failure of a starting gate, the Stewards may declare that the horse to be a non-starter and shall thereupon declare all bets on that horse made on the course, on the day of the race, to be off; and where the horse so declared to be a non-starter was quoted:
 - at odds within the range set out in the table to paragraph (g) of this Sub-Rule, all on-course winning straightout bets, made on the day of the race, shall be subject to deduction from their face value the amount set out in that table; and
 - (II) at "odds on" the Stewards shall declare that all winning on course bets, made on the day of the race, must be paid at totalisator odds.



STEWARDS' REPORT

GLOUCESTER PARK - WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 13, 1974

RACE 1: SIR DAVID which was found to be suffering from collic was withdrawn on vet's advice. VELVET PFINCE galloped badly at barrier rise - a warning was issued. BARUNDAH LADY also galloped at barrier rise. This pacer will be excluded from the draw for a period. GRAZIN-UTA was a little slow into stride. The onus was placed on the connections to correct the fault of this horse pulling so hard in its races. It was noted that BIN ADIOS was unable to secure a clear passage over the concluding stages of the race. KIWI RAIDER was checked shortly after the start behind the galloping VELVET PRINCE.

RACE 2: HIPPY JAY galloped badly in the score up but was pacing and in its station when the start was effected. F. R. Kersley was severely reprimanded for allowing his horse BIN DULI to move out in the run to the winning post.

RACE 3: WEE CENT missed the start and galloped sideways checking JIMMY LEE and SPEEDY BEN. A warning was issued in respect to WEE CENT. ROYAL GAZE galloped badly at barrier rise. This pacer will be excluded from the draw for a period. DURANTE left its feet in the back straight the first time. Sangalli stated that the horse was making up ground fast when the field slowed and he had to check DURANTE. This caused him to leave his feet. A warning was issued. YALLARA was slightly checked when YANKEE RHYTHM took up a position in front of that pacer in the early part of the race. Poyser was severely reprimanded and told to exercise every care in future. T. Peck was severely reprimanded for indecisevness in the early stages of the race and occupying two positions for some considerable distance causing ROYAL VANCE to be inconvenienced.

RACE 4: FARMER ELECT broke in the score up. This was caused by PARK LODGE galloping from the second line. PARK LODGE again galloped in the front straight but had regained his gait when the start was effected. PARK LODGE will be excluded from the draw in Mobile barrier starts. Turning into the back straight the first time ASTOR SMOKE was severely checked and left its feet. This was caused by the pace slackening suddenly. It was noted that ASTOR SMOKE was checked in the score up when PARK LODGE left its feet. J. R. Moore reported that a back carrier of MEADOW HALL's hopples had broken when racing for the bell.

RACE 5: The Association's Veterinary Surgeon was requested to inspect PALEFACE ADIOS (NSW) on his arrival on the course. The vet declared the horse fit to start. BRET ARMAGH (Vic.) K. Wills galloped at the start severely checking ROYAL FORCE J. Retzlaff, A warning was issued in respect to BRET ARMAGH. Moving down the front straight the second time WAITAWHILE BOY (NSW) R. Pracey was forced out of its position when ROSCOTT L. Lindau moved sharply off the fence. L. Lindau was found to be at fault and was suspended from driving in races for two (2) scheduled metropolitan meetings. On the turn out of the front straight the last time WELCOME ADVICE (NSW) B. Clarke was checked and became unbalanced for a short distance. This was found to have been caused by R. J. Starkie moving out of the one wide line causing WELCOME ADVICE to become unbalanced. R. J. Starkie was suspended from driving in races for two (2) scheduled metropolitan meetings. R. Grantham SHANAGAR was severely reprimanded for taking up a position in front of WAITAWHILE BOY shortly after the start causing WAITAWHILE BOY to be slightly checked.

RACE 6: It was noted that DARREN'S GIFT S. Ashby was unable to secure a clear passage over the concluding stages of the race. BANGALORE R. Grantham and YOUNG ROBBIE K. Tyler were a little slow to begin.

RACE 7: HARLERAY (Qld.) R. J. Smith galloped badly at barrier rise. This pacer will continue to be excluded from the barrier draw. As the field moved out of the back straight the last time, MISS DUNDEE M. R. Johnson was checked and lost some ground, This was caused by SIGN AGAIN L. Lindau moving off the fence at this point causing MISS DUNDEE to be hampered for room. Linday was found responsible and a severe reprimand was issued. Lindau was told that had it not been for the fact that action was taken against him for a previous race incident, a suspension would have resulted from this particular incident.

NOTICE TO PATRONS

CONDITIONS OF RACING

All races to be run under the Rules of Racing made under the Constitution and Rules of the Western Australian Trotting Association.

In all races when two or more horses are on identical marks, the horse whose name appears first will occupy No. 1 pole position, the other positions following in rotation,

REFUSAL OF NOMINATION

The Committee may, in its absolute discretion, at any time after receipt of a nomination, cancel the same without giving any reason therefor. RE-HANDICAPPING OF HORSES

If, after the handicaps are declared for a race a horse wins or is placed in another race, the handicap of that horse may be re-adjusted by the Handicapper.

STARTING Horses are under the starter's orders after the whistle has been blown to take their positions at the barriers.

PROTESTS

A driver of a competing horse placed 1st to 5th inclusive, may protest against the winner, or any placed horse on the grounds of interference, crossing, jostling, or any improper act or conduct of the driver of such horse. The protest must be made to a Steward BEFORE THE DRIVER LEAVES THE TRACK AND PRIOR TO ALL CLEAR BEING DECLARED.

BOOKMAKERS

The public is notified that Bookmakers must set the investor up to \$500 on the price shown on the Board until the sounding of the horn calling the horses to the barrier (approximately 3 minutes to the start of each race), after which time the limit of liability shall be \$200.

In the event of a dead heat, payment will be made on a basis of half

the value of the ticket.

On all Betting tickets issued by Bookmakers the name of the Horse and the amount of the Bet must be clearly written. Should a dispute arise and it is found that this has not been done, a decision may be given against the Bookmaker.

Investors must check their tickets for the correct Name of Horse and Amount, as no claim will be recognised after the acceptance of the

Ticket.

All credit bets must be confirmed by the investor with the Bookmaker concerned, prior to the start of the race.

No person other than the Bookmaker, or his Employee shall be upon the Betting Stand of that Bookmaker,

LOST BETTING TICKETS

Assistance by the Stewards in recovering bets made on the course, can only be afforded to patrons who have lost their betting tickets if they can name the bookmaker.

WIN AND PLACE TOTALISATOR

Ask for Numbers, Not Names
The date of Ticket can be identified by the Meeting number.

PLACE TOTE

Pays First, Second and Third Horse where 8 or more starters. Pays First and Second Horses only where 7, 6, or 5 starters, Where 4 or less starters, only Win tickets will be sold.

INVESTORS SHOULD NOTE Every purchaser of a Ticket must satisfy himself that he has received the Ticket he applied for, and every holder, entitled to a dividend must see that he has proper dividend before leaving the window, as no subsequent claim will be recognised.

TOTALISATOR DUTY ACT BY-LAW 9 No dividend shall be recoverable or paid except on presentation of the ticket for which the dividend is claimed, or after the expiration of a months from the date of the declaration of the dividend.
