

In 1935, Western Australian Trotting Association chairman, Mr John Stratton (pictured) laid the foundations for today's prestigious Inter Dominion Championships. Little did Stratton know that his tireless efforts 50 years ago would have had such a lasting legacy.

The Magnetism of The InterDominion

The magnetism surrounding the InterDominion is something more than this event being the richest carnival for harness racing outside North America. It is something every red-blooded harness racing fan in Australia and New Zealand feels at this time each year. It can be fun and games, but it is also a rivalry between friends, whether it be as a trainer, a driver, an owner, or a punter.

To find the origins of our most prestigious event, one must go back into history to March 4, 1896 to Moonee Valley, the very venue where this 1985 series is being held. It was on the grass track used mainly for thoroughbred racing that the first real contest was held for the best standardbreds in Australia and New Zealand. It was named the "Inter Colonial Free For All" and consisted of three heats in the one afternoon.

Representing New Zealand was the champion mare Calista. Her rivals were the trotters Fritz, Osterley and St Louis, and the leading pacer of the day, Mystery. The most interesting horse in the field was the champion Fritz. In only a handful of starts he had proven himself so superior to any other trotter seen in the country that owners of other horses would refuse to race against him. But because that race in 1895 was being billed as the first championship for horses from the two countries, officials had found it possible to bring together the best horses of their time.

It is history how Fritz dominated the three heats so convincingly that he not only slashed more than 10 seconds

from the previous Australasian mile record, but in the final heat he arrived at the winning post before any of his rivals had entered the home straight. No horse since has been able to blitz the one mile record like this remarkable gelding did that day. It was to be 30 years before another championship was to be organised for the top performers from the two countries.

In 1923, Western Australian Trotting Association president, James Brennan, put forward a plan to introduce the Australasian Pacing Championship with the series to be rotated among the leading States, and New Zealand. His efforts virtually fell on deaf ears, with Brennan and his association deciding to go it alone with such a championship in 1925 in Perth at the cricket ground, then the home of harness racing in that city.

It seems the struggling sport was not yet ready for a major event as the series organised by Brennan had not been the success he had expected. Transporting horses from the eastern States had been just one of several problems which had been a hurdle the WATA could not overcome. The financial loss incurred by the association and its president was quite considerable. Consequently, the concept of an Australasian Pacing Championship was laid to rest.

During the following few years the country experienced its worst ever depression, and it was not until 1935 that another move was made to bring to harness racing a prestigious event which could become to the sport what

the Melbourne Cup had for so long meant to thoroughbred racing. The man behind this move was Victorian born John Stratton, who enlisted the assistance of New Zealand's Harry Nicoll in helping to convene a meeting in Sydney of representatives from all States.

From that conference was born the InterDominion Championship, with Perth being allocated the first series for 1936, as Stratton (then WATA chairman) had worked so tirelessly in bringing such an event to fruition. The track on which that historic carnival was first held was Gloucester Park, which had previously been known as Brennan Park, in honor of the man who had been responsible for establishing what was then the finest trotting track in the country.

The 14 officials who had met in Sydney to draw up the conditions for the birth of the modern InterDominion Championships, made what was to become a controversial issue when deciding how the points for the heats would be distributed. Before the initial series got under way, no one could foresee the problems this would throw up. The points were 3, 2 and 1 for the first three placings, and 3, 2 and 1 for the three fastest times in each race. On paper, this seemed reasonable.

However, the almost absurd situation arose when one of the frontmarkers, Logan Derby, went through the heats and final unbeaten, only to see the title of champion awarded to Evicus (which had not won a heat or the final) because the mare had earned more points because of her faster times coming off 24 yards behind.

This strange situation was to arise in two further series before officials moved to correct the anomaly. New Zealand's first InterDominion in 1938 saw Pot Luck take out the grand final from the mare Parisienne, but it was the latter which was crowned the champion by virtue of having earned more points during the carnival.

The frustration of grand final winners not being awarded the championship was to occur for the last time in 1940 when the series returned to Perth. New Zealand's Grand Mogul led the field home in the final, but the champion that year was Logan Derby, which amassed more points. It was ironical that Logan Derby, which lost the very first InterDominion though unbeaten, should finally become champion in this manner.

The InterDominion has long been the "shop window" for harness racing in the southern hemisphere, as the most outstanding performers in Australia and New Zealand are paraded each year before the public. The championship has been the thread upon which the sport in modern times is strung between two growing countries with so much in common.

It is a tribute to the early administrators, the horses and the men who drove them, that the series has grown in stature with each passing year and today is one of the great sporting events on the calendar for both countries. Founded for the purpose of bringing the best horses in Australia and New Zealand together, the 1980s could

well see a major breakthrough with horses from North America becoming a regular entry into the championships when attracted to compete on the Australian Grand Circuit.

The InterDominion has a rich past as the event is steeped in great horses, stories of triumphs and disappointments. But its future seems assured as the depth in quality now to be found has led officials to make it a true championship with horses racing off the same mark. Sensations have never been far away from every series, and no doubt Moonee Valley in 1985 will provide the media with numerous dramatic events to keep the name of leading horses in the limelight as they strive for points to secure a berth in the grand final.

The sporting world is continually changing, but perhaps many of its people basically remain the same. No matter what form of progress seems to overtake our lifestyle, people everywhere still respond to an exciting challenge on the sports field when it comes to any test of strength, courage, speed and skill.


The major spectator sports today, in offering colorful entertainment with action, thrills and even spills, may look a whole lot different, but they still provide an outlet for the public in much the same way as those "sports" in the colosseum did for Roman culture at the height of the Roman Empire. People love a champion, and they delight in paying homage to the best of them all.

Every field of sports endeavour possesses one great event to stand out from the rest — an event or carnival whose magnetism attracts only the most outstanding performers who come together to do battle until finally one emerges to be crowned the new champion of champions.

For harness racing fans in Australia and New Zealand, this event is the annual InterDominion Championship. It has become a carnival in which the adrenalin flows a little faster for participator and spectator. The thrill of being part of this great event becomes a moment to be enjoyed and savoured, and later, after the dust has settled and the crowds departed, an event to be cherished in one's memory.

The InterDominion Championship is more than a test of speed and stamina. It is one thing to set a horse for one special race on a particular day as is the case for the best thoroughbred stayers in the Melbourne Cup. But it is another to prepare a pacer to contest four gruelling races in a fortnight. Only the fittest and the toughest survive the three nights of heats leading up to the final where the field is decided on points, and not reputation.

Apart from the few remaining small tracks which can assist the speedy squib drawn favorably off the front row, an InterDominion Final is no place for the faint hearted. Often the heart of a horse that can overcome the setbacks and the fierce competition in the heats, has to be as strong as the straight is long. More than one InterDominion champion earned its title by surviving those final metres on heart alone after having given its all in the two weeks leading up to the big race.

HOW TO PLACE YOUR BETS

If you are new to harness racing, we know you might find all the sights, sounds and activities just a bit confusing at first. But, with the help of a race book or form guide and the basic betting information below, you'll soon discover how enjoyable and profitable your harness racing experience can be!

WIN BET





Easy – just pick the runner you think will finish first in any race.

PLACE BET





Easier still! To win a Place bet, all you have to do is pick one runner that finishes either first, second or third in any race.

This gives you three chances to win and costs just 50 cents. If the runner you have chosen is "scratched", your money will be refunded.

If there are less than eight runners in the race, first and second Place dividends only will be declared. If there are four runners or less, a Win dividend only will be declared.

WIN & PLACE

You can also take a Win and Place bet, a combination of both bet types as previously explained. If you take a Win and Place bet and your runner wins, both Win and Place dividends are paid. If your runner finishes either second or third, a Place dividend only is paid.

QUINELLA




To play a quinella, all you have to do is pick two runners to finish first and second in the same race — in any order.

In the example above, runners 4 and 5 have been chosen to finish either first or second. If runner 4 finishes first and runner 5 finishes second, or runner 5 finishes first and runner 4 finishes second, you're a winner.

You can play a Quinella on all races and it costs just

BOX QUINELLA





To increase your chances of winning, you can also take a Box Quinella. This covers three or more runners to finish first and second in a race, in any order.

Based on the example above, the runners are 4, 5 and 6. As you can see, all three runners have been covered to finish first and second.

On the 50 cents per unit price bet, a box of three runners (as per the example above) would cost \$1.50. 4 runners boxed = \$3.00 6 runners boxed = \$7.50 7 runners boxed = \$10.50

The cost of a Multiple Double will vary according to the number of runners you have chosen for each leg. If you don't have the time to calculate the cost of your Multiple Double, ask our friendly staff to assist you. The cost may be calculated by multiplying the number of

selections in each leg. Based on our example, runners 4, 5 and 6 have been chosen to finish first in the 1st leg (race 4) and runners 7 and 9 chosen to finish first in the 2nd leg (race 6)

= 3 x 2 = 6 combinations. Based on the 50 cents per unit cost for each combination, the cost for our example is \$3.00.

FIELD DOUBLE

Another example of a Multiple Double is a Field Double. This is where you select the winner of one leg and take the total field (all runners) in the other leg. For example, if you select runner 4 to win the 1st leg with the field in the 2nd leg, and runner 4 wins the 1st leg, you have won the Double. Of course, you may wish to take more than one runner with the field.

To win a Quadrella, you must pick the winners of four designated races.

The four races of the Quadrella are selected from the programme and are advised in the daily press and at all TAB outlets prior to the race meeting.

The four races selected for the Quadrella are referred to as leg 1, leg 2, leg 3 and leg 4. This is because different races are selected at different meetings

In our example, race 4 (1st leg), race 5 (2nd leg), race 6 (3rd leg) and race 7 (4th leg) have been nominated for the Quadrella. Runner 4 has been chosen to win the 1st leg, runner 5 to win the 2nd leg, runner 7 to win the 3rd leg and runner 8 to win the 4th leg.

If there are more than nine runners in a race, two or more will be "bracketed" from 1 to 9. When placing your Quadrella bet, the winning bracket must be chosen for each of the four races.

If you want to increase your chances of winning, take a Multiple Quadrella. You can pick as many runners as you like to win in any of the four legs of the Quadrella.

The cost for a Multiple Quadrella will vary according to the number of runners you have chosen for each of the four nominated races (legs). If you don't have the time to calculate the cost of your Multiple Quadrella. ask our friendly staff to assist you.

TRIFECTA






To win a Single Trifecta, you must pick the runners you think will finish first, second and third in <u>correct</u> finishing order.

In the example above, runner number 4 has been chosen to finish first, runner number 5 has been chosen to finish second and runner number 6 has been chosen to finish third.

BOX TRIFECTA



Another way to increase your chances of winning is to take a Box Trifecta. This covers three or more runners to finish first, second and third, in any order.

On the 50c per unit bet, a box of three runners would cost \$3.00.

This is calculated as follows:

Based on the example above the runners are 4.5 and 6. Look below and you will see

that the three runners have been covered in every order of finishing first, second and third:

456 465 546 564 645 654 ...thus giving you a total of 6 combinations = \$3.

To calculate mathematically how much boxes cost per 50c unit you should multiply down as follows:

Four runners (24 combinations) = $4 \times 3 \times 2 =$ 24 ÷ 2 = \$12.00


Five runners $(60 \text{ combinations}) = 5 \times 4 \times 3 = 60 \div 2 = 30.00

Six runners $(120 \text{ combinations}) = 6 \times 5 \times 4 = 120 \div 2 = \60.00

Seven runners (210 combinations) = $7 \times 6 \times 5 =$ 210 ÷ 2 = \$105.00







EDGAR TATLOW MEMORIAL STAKES FINAL (Two-Year-Old Fillies): The following horses were pre-race blood tested with a negative result in each case: "Saunders Idol", "Fire Bye", "Len Tara Country" and "Tender Trap".

"Saunders Idol" (A. D. Peace), which began badly, will be given only one more chance in the barrier draw.

The Stewards questioned J. H. McDermott "Jenna Fame" and A. D. Peace "Saunders Idol" regarding an incident which occurred near the 800 metres where "Saunders Idol" broke. After taking evidence from the drivers concerned, acting on their own observations and viewing the official film, the Stewards charged J. H. McDermott with careless driving under Rule 265 for allowing "Jenna Fame" to shift out when not sufficiently clear of "Saunders Idol", causing "Saunders Idol" to be checked, become unbalanced, and break. McDermott was found guilty as charged, and his licence to drive was suspended for two weeks.

In the home straight on the final occasion, "Jenna Fame" (J. H. McDermott) was inconvenienced and tightened for room when racing between "Artlimond" (R. Pace) on its inside when "Artlimond" shifted out under pressure, and "Tender Trap" on its outside when this horse shifted in under pressure. After questioning the drivers concerned, acting on their own observations and viewing the official film, the Stewards took into account the fact that both "Artlimond" and "Tender Trap" were hanging, but informed drivers R. Pace "Artlimond" and K. J. McFarlane "Tender Trap" that they would be expected to exercise greater control over their mounts in similar circumstances.

INTERDOMINION PACING CHAMPIONSHIP (Fifth Heat): The following horses were pre-race blood tested with a negative result in each case: "Wattles Winger", "Paleface Bubble", "Otani" and "Thor Lobell".

"Thor Lobell" (S. D. Dove) raced roughly in the score-up, and lost ground as a result. S. D. Dove explained to the Stewards that the tongue tie attached to "Thor Lobell" had worked loose and the horse got its tongue over the bit and raced ungenerously.

"Wattles Winger" (N. E. Coy) broke without interference near the 200 metres. A veterinary examination by the Board's Veterinary Surgeon, Dr. W. B. Gilbo, following the race revealed that "Wattles Winger" had a small cut on its near fore heel.

Turning out of the front straight on the first occasion, "Paleface Lyndy" (N. Webberly) was tightened for room when "Wattles Winger" (N. E. Coy), which was attempting to obtain a position in the one wide line, shifted in. The near-side mudguard attached to the sulky of "Wattle Winger" was dislodged as a result of this tightening. As the Stewards were unable to question N. E. Coy tonight, an inquiry into this incident was adjourned until Saturday next.

Routine swab samples were taken from "Enterprise" (P. G. Shand) and "Nardin's Castle" (A. D. Peace), the winner and second placegetter in the event.

INTERDOMINION TROTTING CHAMPIONSHIP (Third Heat): The following horses were pre-race blood tested with a negative result in each case: "Sadie Gale", "Honey John", "Zebec" and "Joanie Toliver".

"Licence" (W. B. Clarke), which broke near the despatch point, will be excluded from the mobile barrier draw.

Routine swab samples were taken from "Scotch Notch" (G. A. Lang) and "Zebec" (R. D. Butt), the winner and second placegetter in the event.

INTERDOMINION PACING CHAMPIONSHIP (Sixth Heat): The following horses were pre-race blood tested with a negative result in each case: "Toby Duane", "Dyama", "Camelot" and "Bundanoon".

"Thor Skipper" (T. E. Demmler) began to race fiercely when being eased soon after the start in an endeavour to obtain a position close to the rail, and broke as a result. Demmler was advised to take the necessary steps to ensure that "Thor Skipper" races truly in the future.

The Stewads questioned A. D. Peace "Man of the Moment", B. Hancock "Bundanoon" and R. D. Butt "Camelot" regarding an incident which occurred near the 400 metres where "Man of the Moment" was tightened for room, and broke as a result. After taking evidence from the drivers concerned, acting on their own observations and viewing the official film, the Stewards established that when "Camelot", which had been hanging in throughout the race, again hung in, taking "Bundanoon" down towards the rail, it resulted in "Man of the Moment" being tightened for room and having to be checked. As a result, "Man of the Moment" broke. "Thor Skipper" (T. E. Demmler) was inconvenienced as a result of this incident.

B. Hancock "Bundanoon" was reprimanded for dropping one foot from the footrest over the concluding stages of the race. Hancock was informed that, should he offend again in this manner, more severe action will be taken.

Routine swab samples were taken from "Preux Chevaier" (B. J. Perkins) and "Quite Famous" (J. O'Sullivan), the winner and second placegetter in the event.

INTERDOMINION PACING CHAMPIONSHIP (Seventh Heat): The following horses were pre-race blood tested with a negative result in each case: Game Oro'', "My Lord Louie'', "Rite'' and "Gallant Thor".

The Stewards questioned B. R. Gath "Karamea Duplicity" regarding this horse breaking for a few strides near despatch point. After taking evidence from the drivers concerned, acting on their own observations and viewing the official film, the Stewards charged driver M. R. Boyle with careless driving under Rule 265 for allowing "Fourjay" to shift in when not sufficiently clear of "Admiral Aaron", causing "Admira Aaron" to be tightened for room and taken down on to "Magazine McDonna", which bumped the running rail as a result. "Admiral Aaron" broke as a result of this tightening Boyle was found guilty as charged, and his licence to drive was suspended for four weeks.


